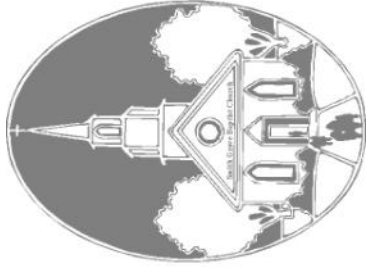

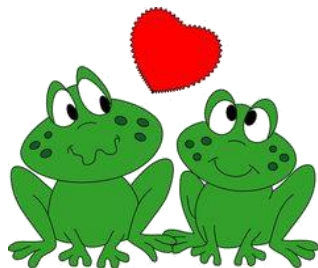

It was so refreshing to kick off our summer at the icy top of the world... "Operation Arctic" was wonderful, and we're grateful for the awesome effort from the entire VBS team and all our church family! It was the kind of week we're always sad to see come to an end, filled with the smiles of over 100 participants, the memories of united teamwork, and blessed truths from God's Word. As we explored the "coolest Book on the planet," we collected an offering of \$470 for the Gideons, which will provide 94 Bibles to share around the world. Along the way, we learned that the Bible is the "Book of Books"... and Blizzard, that unique, one-of-a-kind polar bear, showed us that Scripture is God-inspired and like no other book in all of history! Snowball the Arctic Hare reminded us that the Bible has had an "Incredible Impact" on mankind because God's Word is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path. From his spot beneath the shifting chunks of ice in the ocean, Spike the Narwhal taught us that we need to build our lives on the unwavering foundation of God's Word, the "Bedrock Base." Because she gently cares for her young, Shaggy the Musk Ox sweetly reminded us that the Bible is a "Letter of Love," written to us, from the Creator of the Universe, so that we can know His message of redemption. Lastly, we met Dash the Siberian Husky, who taught us that God's Word is "Exciting to Explore"... and we should approach reading it with the exuberance and excitement of a bounding sled dog exploring the fascinating, frosty land of the arctic! We pray that all our explorers have a renewed desire to "**Learn It, Love It, and Live It!**" May our theme verse ring true in our hearts as we strive to more deeply pursue God's Word... "*Open Thou mine eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of Thy Law.*" (Psalm 119:18) What a treasure we have in the B-I-B-L-E... hopefully we won't ever spell it again without remembering what every letter means for us!

As we gathered each night at Grizzly Scottie's Lodge in Snowfall Station, we also met "Nutaroyok," an adorable arctic hare who befriended our biggest sled dog, Scooby-Doo. We nicknamed our new friend "Roy." After listening in on our lessons about God's simple plan of salvation, Roy realized he needed Jesus in his life, and we listened as Roy invited Jesus to be his Savior! As it turns out, "nutaroyok" is an Inuit word that means "is new," and we were reminded of the way a little arctic hare is transformed when the seasons change... brown fur in the summer turns to white fur in the winter. But when Roy put his faith in Christ, his transformation went beyond what we could see on the outside; he was changed from within! Because Roy has been made "new," his life now reflects what his long Inuit name meant all along, and our explorers rejoice in the transforming power that God offers through His Son!



The classrooms throughout Glacier Gap were meticulously decorated by our teachers, who sacrificed time and talents to ensure explorers were transported to a winter wonderland of sparkling snow and ice. The Arctic truly came to life with their creative ideas! We're thankful to the Lord for these faithful guides. ## Heart to Heart - (October 2014)

### One year past transplant . . .

It was with bated breath and pounding hearts that we watched the car pull into our driveway that October morning. A precious dad, grandmother, and granddad climbed out of the car. We were meeting for the first time, yet we immediately felt a connection that words can't describe. This was our Donor Family ~ Aaron's family.

Aaron was the caring young man who decided at the time he learned to drive that he wanted to become an organ donor; the young man who gave our son Johnny a second chance at life. Our gratitude to Aaron is immeasurable, and the love we feel for his family is fathoms deep. Aaron's dad shared a photograph album with pictures of Aaron ~ baby, youth, and young adult. His face showed a great deal of happiness ~ a face of someone who knows he is loved. He had the love and support of special people in his life, family members who were there during the difficult times that threatened to cast a dark shadow on that happiness and get his life off track. Thank God for those special people.

We learned that twelve weeks prior to his fatal accident, Aaron was in a truck accident and suffered some pretty extensive injuries, including two broken legs and cracked ribs. At that time, Aaron told his dad that God had brought him through the accident for a reason, that he knew God had a special purpose for his life. Aaron spent the next twelve weeks getting closer to his Savior as he recovered from his injuries. He also spent long hours talking to his dad, discussing some of the important things of life that we don't always talk about. How could they know these would soon become precious memories for this grieving dad.

It was on a Sunday morning, as he was riding his bike to church, that Aaron was hit by another vehicle and suffered fatal injuries. In the short time that followed, this grief-torn family honored Aaron's wishes as an organ donor, and others were ultimately given the gift of life through Aaron. His dad told us that he truly believed God had orchestrated these events, that His work in Aaron's life was so apparent. To honor Aaron, their church held an Organ Donor Registration later in the year. What amazing strength this family has shown. Before Aaron's family left us, his dad, a registered nurse, asked if he could listen to Johnny's heartbeat. I will tell you, this mother's heart was broken as Aaron's dad closed his eyes and listened to the steady beat of his son's heart, this heart that gave new life to our son. Proverbs 14:30a says, "A sound heart is the life of the flesh." I praise the Lord for this sound heart! And this was beautiful to see – heart to heart and spirit to spirit.



Johnny was profoundly touched by this dear family's visit, and we are eternally grateful for their outreach in love. Please join us as we pray each day for each of them – that God will comfort and bless their family. And thank you, church family, for your unflinching prayers for Johnny. May God bless you.

### Where to start . . . what to say . . . (August 2013)

How do we say thank you for your constant thoughts and prayers? There is no doubt that the prayers of God's saints wrought a miracle in our lives.

The prayers began in the Ladies' Prayer Room last August. Johnny had a defibrillator implanted that month, yet he felt exhausted at the end of every work day. I shared my worry with the dear ladies there . . . they took up my burden and assumed the mantle of prayer on Johnny's behalf. His tiredness continued and all the prayer warriors of our church and family began to pray. In December, Johnny was admitted to the hospital in critical condition . . . God answered prayer in the form of talented doctors who saved his life with a Left Ventricular Assist Device (LVAD, or heart pump) which was run by electricity and took over the pumping function of the heart. He did well until mid-April when he developed a blood clot in the implanted heart pump. Again, God answered prayer as Johnny underwent a second surgery and the pump was switched out for a new one. All the while our church and precious saints from many other churches prayed. (A dear church in Greensboro [Center UMC] made a prayer cover in the form of a beautiful blanket that they had prayed over as it was created. Johnny was truly "covered" in prayer [& the Duke Blue Devil logo – his favorite team!]. They also committed to future daily prayer.) Recovery was slower with this surgery, but even so Johnny's health improved to the point that he was able to be placed on the United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS) Heart Transplant list on July 8. For 30 days, he would be placed on the top status of the list, Status 1A.

At 11 p.m. on July 30, Johnny's doctor called from Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center. There was a possible donor . . . wait for our call and be ready. At 5 a.m. the next morning, the call came and off we went. That day was packed full of orchestrated procedures by a myriad of skilled individuals – a tireless, unified transplant team. On August 1, after 12 hours of surgery, Johnny left the operating room with a brand, new heart! A miracle indeed . . . People prayed; a grief-torn family gave; talented doctors fulfilled their calling; God wrought a miracle . . . as this transplanted heart began to beat to the rhythm of a new life.

Thank you, donor family, for your unbelievable gift in the midst of your own pain; thank you, prayer warriors, for your dedication; thank you, doctors, for your caring and long hours of pain-staking work; thank you, nurses, for excellent daily care; thank you, family, for your support; and thank you, Precious Father, for this gift of life. Not only does Johnny have his eternal life secured through Jesus Christ, he now has the hope of a healthy life here on earth.

## Assistance or Resistance?

“That ye receive her in the Lord, as becometh saints, and that ye assist her in whatsoever business she hath need of you: for she hath been a succourer of many, and of myself also.” – Rom.16:2

The Apostle Paul begins this chapter with words of commendation to a godly lady by the name of Phebe. She was a Gentile and the one who delivered the Epistle to Rome. She was a servant or “deaconess” in the church at Cencrea. Her testimony, service, and contribution to the ministry, were worthy of recognition and respect. Her ministry was directed towards the overall good of the church and was not a personal agenda driven activity. She served for the glory of God and the advancement of His work through the local church.

Paul’s challenge to the church was a challenge to “assist” this dear lady in her work. Their assistance of her was an assistance of God’s work in that particular local church.

We listen to political news today and hear the attacks of the critics of our President and the efforts to resist and oppose his leadership. The motivation of many of the radical left-winged politicians is nothing more or less than an agenda driven motivation! Political and partisan agendas have become more valuable than the overall good of the Nation! The right kind of political leadership values the good of the Nation a greater priority than advancement of party and agenda! The crossing of party lines should be a “no brainer” when it comes to assisting in legislation and policies which make America a better Country!

Yes, we do need to “resist the Devil!” However, ministry is not about pride and preeminence but rather humility and service. God blesses the church member who follows the leadership of a God called Pastor and puts self out of the way while assisting the efforts of fellow Christians within the church. Leadership positions within the church that are self imposed run a great risk of becoming positions to exploit self interest rather than interests relative to church spiritual health.

Whatever we do is to be done for the glory of God. Our approach towards church ministry should always be more of an approach of humble service. A humble servant of the Lord will invariably assist other fellow servants for they are wise enough to know that the advancement of the Lord’s work is more important than the advancement of personal ambitions and agendas.

**Ministry:** All I can say as I sit to write this letter is what a mighty God we serve, since our last letter we have seen the Lord meet many needs and bless richly. Perhaps the most exciting prayer

answered is that God has given us a property for the church and it is better than we could have asked for. We held our first services in this property on June the 4th where we had 11 people in each service, 3 of which were visitors. The exciting thing about that is that our grand opening is not until the 25th, we haven’t even started advertising and God is giving us visitors; that is an awesome answer to prayer. Concerning our grand opening please keep us in prayer as we prepare the property and begin really pushing to advertise this special service. I am having 25,000 flyers printed and will go door to door distributing these with gospel tracts as well as giving them during our Saturday street ministry. We are also holding midweek services already in the church where I have chosen to try my hand at preaching in Romanian. This decision was made because currently everyone attending our services speaks Romanian and on Sundays we are translating the messages for those who require it, but in order to move away from the need of a translator I felt the Lord would have me to take the very very little Romanian I know and put it to use beginning on Wednesday nights. There is a high population of Romanian speaking people in Gent and so if we can minister in English and Romanian we will be able to reach most everyone in the city, until I can start Dutch language school in September. In addition to the normal preparation for a church building we were able to partner with a church here in Belgium to help them get pew chairs they were trying to raise money for, allowing them to get theirs cheaper and for us to start off with nice chairs, which should arrive in August.

**Personal:** Our biggest news has already been made known to many thanks to social media, but Lory and I are expecting a son, he is due the first week of September. So far according to the doctors he is healthy and developing perfectly, but please keep momma and baby in your prayers. This has been a lifelong prayer and desire of mine, to one day have a child of my own, so I cannot express how blessed we are to be able to say that the Lord has saw fit to give us the desire of our hearts. Along with a property for the church we were able to rent a building that works perfectly for us to live in it as well. I will include pictures in our next prayer letter of the property, once I have finished decorating for the church. Instead of a page of pictures, like I would normally send, I am attaching a letter written by Lory to thank all the churches for their kindness to her while in America. **Prayer:** Pray for the street ministry here, that people would continue to be receptive; for Lory and the baby to stay healthy during the pregnancy; for my visa for Belgium as it is almost complete; for the group of believers that I preach to both in Belgium and in Romania, that God would bless them and help with some housing and work related needs they have; for the remainder of our needed support to come; for the shipping container and chairs, for God to provide in this cause; And most of all for the work we do here in establishing a church, that God’s hand and anointing would be on us and that He would be glorified.
