



It has been encouraging to lead our young people down the Bible Timeline with the generation of Joshua. With great concentration one night, each youngster attempted to be the first to transfer a plate of ice cubes to a bowl, using only a pair of toothpick "chopsticks." This iceplaying led us to remember the times we've seen hailstones, which led us to look at an amazing account of God's deliverance of the Israelites, found in the tenth chapter of Joshua.

God's people were developing a reputation throughout the Promised Land... they were feared by cities across the region who had heard of the many conquests and obstacles through which the Lord had brought them. At one point, *five* kings conspired to "gang up" against Israel, thinking there would be strength in numbers. Yet, the Lord said to Joshua,

"Fear them not: for I have delivered them into thine hand; there shall not a man of them stand before thee." Even though God's army had climbed and marched all night, God still gave His people the victory by confusing the Canaanites and bringing a hailstorm to help defeat the uprising of the enemy armies! Knowing that they needed more daylight to finish the attack, Joshua boldly prayed that the sun and moon would stand still. Amazingly, God moved, and daylight was put on hold until Israel's victory was sealed! What a marvel, to see God's sovereignty over the universe, as He instructed all of nature in the defeat of His enemies!

In the years to come, after many victories, an elderly Joshua challenged his people to stay true to the Lord. Looking at a map of the Promised Land from this time, we could see the areas belonging to Israel so far, but there were vast regions still yet to be taken. Joshua encouraged the Israelites to reach their full potential, knowing what they could acquire if they would simply obey Him and put their trust in Him. In our times, we may not be asked to conquer a land, but God IS asking us to do other things that demand His power and strength. If we put our faith in Him rather than ourselves, we can watch Him do amazing and triumphant things through us too!

It was a little sad for us to see Joshua's adventures come to a close. as his life ends after 110 years. Like Moses at his death, Joshua was called a "servant of the Lord," having lived a long life of faithfulness. The last lines of the book of Joshua tell us that the bones of Joseph, carried in the Ark of the Covenant all the way from Egypt, were finally buried in his homeland. Joseph had lived to the age of 110 also, and now, 200 years later, he was at last laid to rest in this land that God had promised to their ancestor, Abraham. From that blessed covenant, and through that special family, God would bring a Savior to bless all the world. Our children were intrigued to see how God's people had come full circle in a sense, as He faithfully led them where He wanted them to be. The unfolding of His plan of redemption is always a wonder, and in this season especially, it blesses our hearts to ponder again how God, through the centuries, aligned each detail, in His perfect timing, to bring His precious Son to earth so that He might give His life for us. Because of His empty tomb on Easter morning, we have His hope in our hearts no matter what we face. In these uncertain times, help us pray that Jesus will stir the hearts of our youngsters, renew their hope, and draw them close.

The Holy Spirit could not fulfill His part in the application of the plan of salvation unless Jesus complete His work at Calvary, be resurrected, and return back to Heaven and fill His position at the Father's right hand.

The preaching of the Gospel, enabled by the power of the Holy Spirit, was the priority of God, for the salvation of lost sinners was the reason that God drew salvation's plan. The coming of the Comforter would mean that the Gospel would go forth, for Jesus totally paid sin's debt by His finished work.

Excerpt from a sermon by Charles Spurgeon

~ He is Risen Indeed!

. . . I wanted to speak, last of all, upon THE AMAZING NEWS which these good women received — "He is not here, but He is risen!" This was amazing news to His enemies. They said, "We have killed Him; we have put Him in the tomb; it is all over with Him." Aha! Scribe, Pharisee, Priest! What have you done? Your work is all undone, for He is risen! It was amazing news for Satan.

He, no doubt, dreamed that he had destroyed the Savior, but He is risen! What a thrill went through all the regions of hell! What news it was for the grave! Now it was utterly destroyed, and Death had lost his sting! What news it was for trembling saints. "He is risen, indeed." They plucked up courage, and they said, "The good cause is still the right one, and it will conquer, for our Christ is still alive as its head." It was good news for sinners. Yes, it is good news for every sinner here. Christ is alive! If you seek Him, He will be found of you. He is not a dead Christ to whom I point you today. He is risen! And He is able to save to the uttermost them that come unto God by Him. There is no better news for sad men, for distressed, desponding, and despairing men than this—the Savior lives, able still, to save, and willing to receive you to His tender heart. This was glad news, beloved, for all the angels, and all the spirits in heaven, glad news indeed for them. And this day it shall be glad news to us, and we will live in the power of it by the help of His Spirit! And we will tell it to our brethren, that they may rejoice with us, and we will not despair any longer. We will give way no more to doubts and fears, but we will say to one another, "He is risen indeed: therefore let our hearts be glad." The Lord bless you, and in coming to His

table, as I trust many of His people will come, let us meet our risen Master. Amen.
