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
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



The White Family – Bolivia Who's Feeding You?: One of my main jobs as a missionary is to train others, especially those who are preparing to serve the Lord with their lives. As I have mentioned before, the longer we are in the ministry here, this becomes a bigger part of what we do and where we invest the most of our time. While there are many lessons and Bible principles that I



try to share with them, one of the most important is probably teaching them to be self feeders and self growers. Just like in the real world, one of the true signs of maturity is when a person doesn't need anyone else to feed them or be responsible for their every need. So here are a few ideas that can help to get to this point of maturity and be a self feeder.

I. Be Attentive ~ One of the greatest spiritual diseases that plagues Christianity today would be spiritual blindness. The average Christian does not recognize where they are lacking or the weaknesses they have. There is also a great lack of biblical knowledge and the principles that would apply even if they recognized their error. So many people go through life either thinking they are fine, or knowing they have problems but not knowing what to do about it. So the first thing we have to do to be a self grower is pray and ask the Lord to show us things that we need to work on in your life and He will.

II. Be Intentional ~ One of the hardest things about spiritual growth is that it doesn't happen by accident. Just as a muscle will not grow if you just sit on the couch, we will not grow spiritually if we don't take specific steps to get there. The same way with spiritual growth, it's not going to happen unless we have a plan. To grow spiritually we must decide today to read our Bible, Pray and Practice what we learn in the Bible.

III. Be Determined ~ When it comes down to it, maybe the biggest hinderances to spiritual growth would be quitting. Growth is hard and takes time that some are not willing to spend but unfortunately the key is just staying at it and little by little you will begin to see the growth take place. Take baby steps and don't put too many expectations on yourself and in no time you will be light years from where you were before. The best part of it all is that when you become a self feeder and mature Christian you can then begin to help others in the same journey you have just been on.

Slow and Steady: ~ In our new church plant we have seen steady progress, and we have a good group that are coming on Sundays faithfully and beginning to even help in the church. Out of those, we have a couple of them that are even coming faithfully to Sunday and Wednesday night services, which is usually the most difficult. One of our desires and focuses with those who are coming is helping them take the next step in their spiritual journey. For some that would be Salvation for other Baptism and for others becoming part of the church and serving. We are now working to help each of them know what that next step is and help them take it. I am excited to see what the Lord is going to do in the following months as His church begins to grow and be effective at reaching others.

Prayer Requests: 1. Pray that those in our church will take the next step in their spiritual lives. 2. Pray as we share the gospel that we will see people sensitive to His word. 3. Pray for those in our Bible College that the Lord will continue to work in their lives. 4. Pray for Pastor Pablo as he works on getting the paper work for their church.

(E) - "Endure" ~ "Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ." – II Timothy 2:3

Hardness goes along with soldiering and being a Christian is soldiering for Jesus Christ and requires the discipline of soldiering!

The child of God is not a passenger on a pleasure cruise ship enjoying a comfortable ride to glory but a soldier on a battle field facing vicious spiritual enemies bent on disarming and disabling those in God's army.

Spiritual "wimps" within the ranks of God's battalion discredit themselves and fellow comrades. Soldiering involves privations, loneliness, exposure to cold or heat, fatigue, and endurance. Discipline is an every daily lifestyle of the soldier. The enemies of America attack the core values of our Country and the spiritual enemies attack the core values of the Christian. The soldier of Jesus Christ must exercise continual discipline in upholding Christian core values and the "basics" necessary for being a good soldier. Prayer, Bible study, Church attendance, witnessing and stewardship are essential in Christian growth and development.

The end of a combat tour usually includes an awards ceremony and the issuance of combat medals. May we at the end of life's combat tour hear His, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant!"



(F) - "Fear" ~ "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." – II Timothy 1:7 It is one thing to be stricken by fear but quite another thing to have the "spirit of fear." Many things in life tend to make us afraid

but fear must not control and lead to negating the duties and responsibilities assigned to Christian ministry. Imagine the difference in the historical records of WWII if the troops storming the beaches of Normandy or the Islands in the Pacific cowered down in fear rather than face the enemy? We all would be speaking German and Japanese!

Power, love, and a sound mind are given by God but not the spirit of fear! We are given the power to get the job done, we are able to keep loving God and the souls of man, and we are enabled to have a balanced mind and see things in their right perspective.

In spite of the threats facing us in the world, we still must keep local churches active and Christians must remain the salt of the earth with a testimony of faith, rather than fear. "Faithful unto death" is the proper inscription on the tombstone of the Christian and not, "Fearful unto death"!

On July 4, 1776, George Washington Bought A Broom

On July 4th, 1776, representatives from what were then British colonies met in Philadelphia to sign the Declaration of Independence. Also that day, George Washington bought a broom.

When Washington became Commander-in-Chief of the Continental Army in 1775, he said he wouldn't accept a salary for the position. But he did say he would accept reimbursement for his expenses.



So he documented everything, from payments to spies to his daily meals. (Apparently, he was a big fan of mutton.) And he was extremely meticulous. Washington's expenses for July 4, 1776, included a broom (which cost 6 pence) as well as mutton, veal, beef, cabbage, beets, beans, potatoes, and lobster. He also paid for the mending of his "Chariot" — a type of carriage.

In 1783, Washington submitted his expense report. He had spent \$160,074. It's hard to adjust for inflation since then, but that number today would certainly be in the millions of dollars.

After a careful audit, the United States Treasury determined that Washington had cut himself short. The US still owed him 89/90 of one dollar.

Declaration of Independence

George Washington did not sign the Declaration of Independence. While the Continental Congress assembled in Philadelphia, Washington and his forces were in New York.

The Continental Congress voted for independence on July 2, 1776. Two days later on July 4, a declaration explaining the reasons for independence, largely written by Thomas Jefferson, was adopted. Washington received an official notification via a letter dated July 6 from John Hancock, the president of the Continental Congress, along with a copy of the declaration.

Alerting the Troops ~ On the evening of July 9, 1776, thousands of Continental soldiers marched to the parade grounds in Lower Manhattan. General Washington had ordered them to assemble promptly at six o'clock to hear a declaration approved by the Continental Congress calling for American independence from Great Britain.

The Declaration of Independence

On July 2, 1776, Congress voted to dissolve the connection between "this country" and Great Britain, declaring the "United Colonies of North America" to be free and independent states.

Revolutionary War Battles

Congress created the Continental Army on June 14, 1775, and John Adams nominated George Washington to serve as the army's Commander-in-Chief. Washington fought in almost two dozen skirmishes and battles during the American Revolution.

Our recent lesson was titled, "Pushing the Limits." This lesson addressed how some try to tiptoe as close to sin as they can without actually "sinning." What do the following all have in common: standing at the edge of a tall building, riding on the highest coaster in the amusement park, eating the hottest pepper in the world, or driving in the direction of a tornado in a storm chaser car?

They each involve risk, a sense of thrill, and pushing the limits of danger! Far too often many try to push the limits of what they know they shouldn't be doing. They want to see what all they can "get away with" without crossing the line and sinning. We asked the question, "Should you be flirting with sin and trying your best to get as close to the edge as possible, or should you have a different focus?"

It seems as if the attitude of pushing the limits is ingrained in our nature, but is this the perspective God wants us to have? We looked to see what the Bible had to tell us. The following verses tell us about the focus we should have. 1 Chronicle 28:9 tells us that God knows our hearts and He wants us to seek Him. Psalm 27:4 tells us that our sole focus should be to grow closer to God and enjoy His presence. Psalm 139:23-24 tells us we should ask God to direct us in His ways. **Proverbs 16:2** tells us that even though we may justify our actions, God knows our motives. 2 Timothy 2:22 tells us that our desire should be to flee things that are opposed to God and pursue things that honor Him.

Be Strong Youth ~ Summer has arrived at last, and our young people are savoring more carefree days with their families... at home, and on fun travels! On the Bible timeline, we have wrapped up another series entitled "Conflict and Problems" as we close out our study of the Book of Judges. Of the judges we've met, some, like Gideon and Jephthah, have been faithful and sincere in following God's truth. Samson is one judge easily recognized by the children, but his adventures remind us how easily we can wander away from the good plans God has for us. Even before his birth, Samson's parents were visited by the Angel of the Lord, declaring that he would be a Nazarite with mighty strength, set apart by God and able to carry out amazing things for Him. This young man was to avoid haircuts and dead things, but as he grew up, Samson didn't always follow God's instructions. He often did what he wanted to do, eating honey from a lion's carcass, and even going so far as choosing an enemy bride from the Philistines. When he later met Delilah, Samson again fell into the trap of disregarding the Lord's plans. We brought this to life by walking an imaginary "tightrope" taped to the floor, noticing how closely we had to watch the placement of our feet. Proverbs 4:26-27 advises, "Ponder the path of thy feet, and let all thy ways be established. Turn not to the right hand nor to the left: remove thy foot from evil.' It's easy to imagine how dangerous it is when a tightrope walker turns to the right



ponder the steps we take, but Samson struggled with this. When he revealed the secret to his strength, Samson was betrayed by Delilah, leading to a tragic haircut, a capture, and imprisonment. So they could taunt him, the Philistines blinded Samson and put him on display at their victory party. It had taken the loss of sight and strength to help Samson finally see that God was the author of His life. With a renewed perspective at last, he humbled himself and asked God for one more chance to use his strength. As Samson pushed the pillars that held up the crowded banquet hall, the building collapsed, killing all the Philistines gathered inside. Yes, Samson got revenge, but because he had always insisted on going his own way, "to the right or to the left," he also ultimately lost his strength, his sight, his freedom, and his life. But Samson was not the only one faltering during this dismal season. The sto-

ries of the judges that close out this book seem to show how far Israel had wan-

dered from the Lord, and the final chapters sadly reflect a falling away of His peo-

ple. The nation was a mess, ignoring God's commands and making up their own

rules: "Every person did that which was right in his own eyes." (17:6) To set up

this lesson, we listened to music clips and tried to guess the instrument playing.

What if a musician played a trumpet but claimed she was playing a violin? We

would think such a statement was ridiculous, but sometimes, people say they are

worshiping God through instruments or songs when they are really just worship-

ping themselves or their talents. We can't tell the difference, but God can, because

or left! In the same way, we make lots of important decisions walking along our

pathway of life. When we seek God's will in the choices we make, we can better









He sees our hearts, and He knows our motives. Judges 17 introduced us to Micah, who ignored God's guidelines and made up his own rules of worship as he went along. He and his mother set up silver idols in their home and hired their own family priest. The people had no real relationship with God, and there was no understanding of what He expected. These were dark days for the Israelites as they floundered, worshipping idols and doing their own thing. We see this especially in the incident at the wicked city of Gibeah, when a violent gang took a woman's life. Her husband sent out messages to all the tribes of Israel, essentially asking, "How did our nation become so fallen?" Israel's armies responded by gathering and demanding that the tribe of Benjamin hand over the criminals. When the tribe refused, a civil war began—the Benjamites against the other 11 tribes! Now God's people were fighting among themselves. After a surprise defeat, the 11 tribes finally made the wisest decision they had made in years. Scripture says they returned to Shiloh, where the Ark of the Covenant stayed. Coming back to God at last, they wept, fasted, and offered sacrifices. In this dark time, God's people could have been wiped out as they made war against one another, but there was still hope... in Shiloh. Our youngsters were blessed to see that "Shiloh" is an Old Testament name for Jesus, established all the way back in Genesis: "The scepter shall not depart from Judah... until Shiloh come: and unto Him shall the gathering of the people be." (49:10) Even throughout the years of falling away, there was still the promise of the triumphant Savior to come, and God was holding true to the covenant He had made. Again and again, these lessons in Judges show us how easily we can lose our way. Burdened with failures and weakness, we could never please a Holy God within ourselves. But in His great mercy, King Jesus came to give His life for us... He alone restores our relationship with the Father, forgiving our sins, and granting peace in this world of turmoil and strife.
