





For the first time in two years, I was able to return to Cuba. Through the time of the pandemic, our missionary met with numerous people, including several Jewish families. During that time, he assisted them with food, medicine, and other personal needs through pandemic relief. During my trip, we visited several of the Jewish homes. It is our greatest prayer that we once again may resume the work that was started several years ago reaching Jews and Gentiles with the gospel and founding new churches in cities that have no Baptist churches. We have planned other trips in September and October.

New York, for me, was like Cuba. For the last several years, I was told not to come to New York because of all the regulations in place by the city government. Even though the people are not real receptive to just taking tracts, let alone speaking to us, it was still a joy for me to work in New York. One of the biggest distractions from people taking tracts was their cell phone. Many people walked by us speaking on their phones, ignoring us. This year, I did have a special experience. We had 14 Oriental people take tracts. You may ask why this is so special. For some reason, Orientals absolutely refuse to take tracts and no one can tell me why. During the five days, we were able to go to different parts of NYC near Jewish communities distributing tracts and Bibles in various languages. It is a little early to decide about going to NY for 9/11 as I have in the past.

A missionary, Brother McDonald, and I decided to postpone our ministry trip to Liberty, NY that we had planned earlier this year. Brother McDonald was told by a Jewish shop owner that he knows, that he will not open his store till later in the month. This will cause the Jewish people that come to Liberty each year to come later. We are considering going in August.

(G) - "Grow" ~ "But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen." – II Peter 3:18

One is justified by grace and thus stand in grace, according to Paul's words in Romans 5:1-2. The "growing" spiritual issue then applies to those justified by grace and standing in grace. No one can grow their way into salvation! Spiritual growth is a command and not an option according to Peter. Individually, every Christian is responsible to avail themselves of all spiritual growth resources and "grow up"! Christian maturity is linked with the enhancement of a deeper knowledge of Jesus Christ. The more about Him we know, the more we grow!

Those who truly believe and obey the "growth" command will be amazed by the joy, strength, and excitement they experience in serving God for their increased love and close walk with Jesus Christ will sustain them through life's battles. Their Christian growth will also result in a better understanding of the real purpose and ultimate design for our life by our Designer. Teen Update ~ Thank you to everyone who has participated in our Sunday Sundaes! We've had an amazing turnout and hope you have all enjoyed the sundaes, banana splits, banana pudding, and ice cream cones. We are looking forward to our remaining nights in August to finish up this special summer treat.

In our Wednesday night meetings, we've discussed the power of the tongue. Our objective was for each of us to consider the power of our words and to commit to using our speech in an uplifting and encouraging way.

When used correctly, our speech can create strong friendships, encourage those around us, and express our love and appreciation for others. When used incorrectly, it can bring pain, destroy relationships, and create ongoing conflict between people.

I'm sure we can all admit that we are guilty of using our speech in both good and bad ways. James 3:10 tells us, "Out of the same mouth proceedeth blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not so to be." For this reason, it's always important to think before we speak.

We read the following verses to see what they had to say about the impact of our words. James 3:3-5 teaches us that even though our tongue is little, it is very powerful. James 3:10-12 tells us that if our words are used to curse and bless then there is a problem. If our hearts are truly stayed upon God, there would be no evil speech from our mouths. Proverbs 12:18 tells us that our words can bring pain or they can bring healing and comfort. Piercing words can cut your heart like a sword being pushed through you. A wise person can use their words to build others up. Proverbs 15:1 tells us that we can use our words to help keep the peace or stir up anger. Having the ability to avoid arguing with someone and to live in harmony with others is a virtue of wisdom. A wise person knows how to speak truthfully, appealingly, and gently.

Next, we read the following verses that show us how we are to use our words in positive ways. 1 Timothy 4:12 tells us to use our speech to be an example to others. We must be a doer of the Word of God, not just a speaker of the Word. Let Christ in you be so great that others will not be able to find any flaw in your way of life. We are to be strong in the faith and in the power of the Spirit. Proverbs 4:24 tells us not to use dishonest and hurtful speech. You can either have a pure heart, or it can be desperately wicked. God will judge our hearts. Our heart controls the moral structure of our lives. A pure heart will bring pure words. **Proverbs 12:15 and 16:24** tells us to use our words as an encouragement to others. A fool is lacking in understanding. We must turn to the counsel of God to be wise. His counsel is the Bible. Wise counsel is the Bible way. Our words reflect our inner motives. Wise words are instructive, pleasant, and life-giving. A wise heart will guide your speech. Wise words are as exciting and pleasurable to hear as ice cream is to eat on a hot day. Pleasant words will bring happiness to a listener. Psalm 19:14 tells us to focus on pleasing God with our speech. God judges the heart of man more than He does the deeds of man. More than anything else that God wants from us, is our great love for Him.

Our speech is an outward reflection of what is in each of our hearts. We must be committed to intentionally using our words in a way that honors the Lord and encourage others around us.

Be Strong Youth ~ On these steamy summer Wednesdays, our youngsters are excited to see our Bible timeline display growing longer! We are now halfway through our study of God's Word, beginning a fifth series called "Crowns and Prophets," which will lead us through the Books of Samuel and Kings.

We began this new study with a humorous game of "Lip Reading Tests," taking turns "mouthing" a phrase while others tried to guess what we were saying. This led us to the introduction of Eli, the priest who misinterpreted the silent words Hannah uttered as she poured out her heart to God in the tabernacle. Desperate for a child, she pleaded with the Lord, vowing to return her son to Him, if He would bless her with one. Indeed, God granted a son, and Hannah named him Samuel. She found deep joy in being able to dedicate her little boy to God, and at a young age, Samuel was brought to the tabernacle, to serve with Eli in the Lord's work.

When we were introduced to Eli's own sons in the next chapter, we found that, although they were priests, Hophni and Phinehas "knew not the Lord." They only went through the motions of religious tradition as they prepared the sacrifices brought to them by the Israelites. For themselves, they took the very best morsels of meat from the burnt sacrifices... the ones that should have been reserved for God! They stole from the Lord, serving themselves above Him, and Eli couldn't persuade them to stop their foolishness. By contrast, Hannah's young son, Samuel, grew in the Lord, and even in his youth, he experienced an encounter with God. While sleeping, Samuel heard someone calling his name. Thinking it was Eli's voice, he arose from his bed and hurried to him. But no, Eli had not called, so he advised the child to go back to bed. The third time this happened, Eli gave Samuel the words to say if it happened again. The last time Samuel heard his name called, he knew it was the voice of God Himself, so the child responded, "Speak, for Thy servant heareth." And the Lord confirmed that Eli and his wayward sons would die, to be replaced by "a faithful priest that shall do according to that which is in mine heart and in my mind: and I will build him a sure house; and he shall walk before mine anointed forever." (I Sam. 2:35) Our children were impressed to see that this spoke of Samuel, a willing child like them, established as Israel's next priest. But it's an even deeper blessing to look beyond Samuel's generation and realize that the Lord is also speaking of our perfect Priest, Jesus! An Old Testament priest stood between God and the sinner, offering a sacrifice to bridge the break between fallen man and our holy Creator. Jesus also stands between our hearts and God's, offering a sacrifice for us... but He didn't just offer up a lamb or a bull. He offered *Himself...* the perfect, sinless, final sacrifice to restore our relationship with our heavenly Father.

It's especially sweet to show our young people that Hannah's generosity eventually brought joy and peace to generations of people. She didn't realize it at the time she gave up Samuel, but this little boy she selflessly dedicated to God would grow up to anoint King David, whose family line would someday include Jesus our Savior. When we give to God sacrificially, we never know how deeply He may use our gifts to bless others. We pray this truth is instilled in their hearts now, so our youngsters will learn to give wholeheartedly to God as Hannah did.
