



Leif Erikson Day is observed on October 9. It honors Leif Erikson, the Norse explorer who led the first Europeans thought to have set foot in continental North America (other than Greenland).

The 1874 book "America Not Discovered by Columbus" by Norwegian-American Rasmus B. Anderson helped popularize the idea that Vikings were the first Europeans in the New World, an idea that was verified in 1960. During his appearance at the Norse-American Centennial at the Minnesota State Fair in 1925, President Calvin Coolidge gave recognition to Leif Erikson as the discoverer of America due to research by Norwegian-American scholars such as Knut Gjerset and Ludvig Hektoen.

On September 2, 1964, Congress unanimously authorized and requested the President to create the observance through an annual proclamation. Lyndon B. Johnson did so that year.

Who are you? What defines you? What makes you, you? These are the questions we asked our teens during a recent lesson. Many are searching for significance in the world today.

Being one out of 7.97 billion people on earth can make it hard to find, though. Still, people are constantly chasing after something to make them feel special, important, or unique.

It could be having the title of homecoming queen/king, having the most You-Tube followers, or getting the most "likes" on Facebook. None of these things will ever determine who you are. They may shape your attitude, and actions, and may even have an impact on your future. Each of these things bases your identity on what someone else says you are. Do we really want our identity based on these earthly things?

None of us have to chase who we are. We don't need an acceptance letter from college, a seat at the popular table, the most friends on Facebook or Instagram, or a group of peers to tell us who we are. Our true identity has been with us all along, and we can find our identity, who we really are, in God's Word. The workmanship in Ephesians 2:10 refers to our spiritual birth. What we are spiritually, in the good sense, is due to God, not ourselves. Although they have no part in gaining salvation, good works have a great deal to do with living out salvation. No good works can produce salvation, but many good works are produced by salvation. We are saved by grace and grace alone. The fruit of our salvation shows in our actions after we are saved. Be Strong ~ Youth

Our youngsters have wrapped up the first book of Samuel as we follow the rocky reign of King Saul. Watching his life spiral out of control and crumble, Saul's story stands as a stark reminder to always trust God's timing and lean on His leading.

Soon after the defeat of Goliath, David became a mili-

tary hero in every battle King Saul assigned him. Scripture shows that the people cheered Saul for slaying his "thousands", and David for his "ten thousands". The seed of jealousy and resentment was firmly planted in Saul's soul as he began to struggle with a bitter evil spirit. Even as David played music to soothe Saul's troubled mind, he found himself repeatedly dodging the javelin the king hurled at him! But God not only planned for David to become king, He also looked far ahead in His plan to send His one and only Son through David's family line. So, time after time, the Lord protected David through dangers as Saul attempted to take his life. No one, not even the powerful leaders on this earth, can thwart God's plan or throw it off course! While David was on the run, we saw his friendship develop with Saul's son, Jonathan, and we were taken through many narrow escapes and cave hide-outs. The beautiful Psalms written by David in these perilous times showed us his dependence on the Lord as He entrusted his life to Him.

One night, we fashioned "boulders" out of play dough, placing them on a map of our neighborhood. What if we had such rugged rock formations blocking our way each day? Wouldn't it be simpler to ask God for direction, depending on Him as we make the rigorous climb over the mountain? In a similar way, Saul's decisions had led to a difficult life full of regret and disappointment... he stubbornly chose the hard way. Saul was terrified to lead the Israelites into battle with the Philistines. Samuel had died, so Saul had nobody to turn to for wisdom. Even though he knew it went against God's law, Saul asked a witch to summon Samuel's spirit. Just as Samuel predicted, Saul's kingdom was torn from him, the Israelites were defeated, and Saul died in battle, along with his sons. Such a tragic ending, but all his life, Saul had gone his own way instead of following God. "Good understanding giveth favor: but the way of transgressors is hard." (Proverbs 13:15) There is a risky trend among "free solo mountain climbers", who use no safety devices or ropes as they climb rocky ledges and cliffs. That's like choosing to "go solo" in life, without tethering ourselves to God. If we make Him Lord of our lives, humbly ask for His guidance, and honor Him in all we do, we are safely anchored to the one true rock, Jesus. And He will fill us with His joy and peace as we climb the steep mountains in our paths...

As I write this letter, I am sitting in the waiting room at Pardee Hospital as Faye is having major back surgery. We are praying it will be a success.

We appreciate your prayers and support. Many of you have supported us for many years. I am so glad the Lord has a perfect record of every prayer, every dollar, and every deed that has been done for Him and His name. HE really does the work, we

just get to follow and watch and give Him Praise. What a Savior we have!

As far as the work, it has been the best year ever, in spite of COVID and the Pandemic. We have had a record year in almost every way, by the Grace of God.

The Sea Hope - the ship God put in our ministry- has been keeping the waters stirred, taking food and supplies to Haiti and St. Vincent. They've also taken Medical Teams into some very dangerous places. They just returned from Haiti having delivered a full load of medical supplies to restore a hospital built 50 years ago by a mission board. In January 2023 the ship will be going again with a team of doctors and nurses. They will use the ship as their sleeping quarters as it will sleep 24 and is fully self contained.

We have been able to help missionaries in Bolivia, Venezuela, Haiti, India, Pakistan, and the Philippines as well as many others in the States. What a great blessing to **watch God** do **His work** through **His people**. There is no way we could do what we do without your help and HIS!

We are presently working with a local church in Hazard, KY., an area devastated by recent flooding. Thank all of you that have had a part in helping with this. We have had truck loads of relief and work crews going almost daily to that devastated area. Please pray for those who lost everything - houses, cars and even family members.

Please pray about my trip to India in October. If everything goes well with Faye's surgery, I plan on leaving October 11th and returning on the 22nd. We will be dedicating two new church buildings. **Praise the Lord!** Thank you for your help with these projects. **The Lord is so good!**

We sure love and appreciate all of you and if I can ever be of help to you in any way please let me know. We sure enjoy serving our Saviour and long for the day when we see Him face to face. I believe this will be very soon. "Look up, your redemption draweth nigh!"


OUR PASTOR By Judy Crowe

Have you ever walked in our Pastor's shoes, And gone where his feet have trod? Have you ever thought of what he means to us, And on your knees, given thanks to God?


