



John 12:26 "If any man serve me, let him follow me; and where I am, there shall also my servant be: if any man serve me, him will my Father honour", I pray that this letter will bring joy and encouragement to you and those you share it with. First of all, we are thanking God for all His marvelous work here in the mission field. As we looked back a yr. ago at how God blessed us with land and a church building at the same time, we also prayed for the church to have its own water supply, and God has mightily proved it time and time again. The deep well project was finished on Jan 13th of this year, and I was able to renew my visa as well this January. I'm now waiting for the approval notice. Please pray that there'll be no problem while the process is ongoing. We are thanking God for using our mission board to help us make our prayers possible through you.

Thank you as well to Brother Tony for the Christmas card and love offering for us and for Ptr. Fain; it helped when we personally needed it most. Furthermore, it is always exciting to work for the Lord; you will hear different life stories and battles testifying to God's saving grace. We have one family that we always visit and share the word of God with. His name is "tatay," which means father "Freddie." This couple made their profession of faith and started joining our church. They are the first family who joined the church in June 2022. His wife had a stroke and is recovering from her illness. But a couple months ago, after our thanksgiving dinner, God called his wife home. Our hearts were saddened, but it is of great joy that we were able to share with her the gospel before God called his wife home.

In my previous letter, I also shared about my plan to come back to the States this coming May for a furlough. Lord willing, I'm planning on raising money for the church vehicle. I have attached a picture of the said vehicle. It is a Toyota rectangular-shaped van, and it cost \$14,550. It has a 12-14 seating capacity. I can say that it is the most reasonable price that we can get for a bigger and brand-new vehicle rather than a regular van, and it will serve its purpose: to get more people to church, to use for bringing materials for teaching kids, tracks and Bibles, and hot meals for our feeding ministry for the fortunate kids in the farther areas and through highways. I am also praying to raise additional support for our family so we can get medical insurance because, aside from being fit spiritually, we also need to take care of our physical health while doing God's ministry work here in the Philippines.

Another thing that really breaks my heart over here is a poor medical system. Based on my experience, they are not going to attend to your medical needs if you don't have money or insurance to take care of your bill immediately. I would like to assure you that everything in the mission field is in order before I leave for furlough. I decided to come back by myself due to our finances, and I'm currently looking at a ticket for myself back and forth for \$1,200. Please pray that God will supply the need for my plane ticket as well. Once again, thank you for your prayers and financial support for our family and the furtherance of the gospel in the small areas of the Philippine Islands.

Be Strong ~ Youth

As springtime begins to unfold, our youngsters are busy filling in the final few steps of our Old Testament timeline. Along the way, we've been introduced to many of the awful kings of Judah and Israel. One of the worst rulers had a power-hungry mother who wanted to reign so badly that she

put to death all the threats to her throne... even her own grandchildren! To say the least, our students were stunned by this wicked grandmother who makes any Disney villain look like a teddy bear! One infant grandson, Joash, was protected from his granny, and hidden away in the temple by his aunt and uncle. Imagine the amusement on their young faces when our children learned that six years later, little Joash was crowned king of Judah...when he was only seven years old! He grew to be one of the few kings "that did right in the sight of the Lord"— cleaning and repairing the neglected temple, breaking down the altars of idolatry throughout the land, and reading the forgotten Word of God to the people. For a while, God's people were refreshed as they turned back to Him, trusting and worshipping Him once again. Sadly though, we're always disappointed to see them fall back into the same dismal habits of rejecting the Lord.

In fact, after our long journey with the Israelites, our students seem to sympathetically identify with them, and it hurts our hearts to repeatedly see their losses and failures. It was especially hard to recently find, in II Kings, the tragic end of the northern kingdom, Israel. We began the night around a table, shooting rubber bands at a pitcher full of water. The height and angle of the water surface made it difficult to hit the target. As sinful humans, we might say that we also "miss the mark" when it comes to God's holy righteousness. As Israel's final king, Hoshea, tried to keep a good relationship with the enemy by paying off the mighty Assyrians, we pondered how things might've changed if Hoshea had only asked God for help against their evil adversary. In time, the next enemy king besieged the land, and the Lord's special people were conquered and carried away in shame... defeated slaves in bondage. For centuries, they ignored the warnings God had given through His prophets and judges, and now, it's a sorrow to see the Lord turn His back on the ones He led for so long. Looking back over the timeline, our youngsters spotted the countless ways God had been faithful to Israel in the past – delivering them from the plagues in Egypt; parting the Red Sea as pharaoh's army trapped them; keeping, leading, and providing through the wilderness; as well as allowing them to conquer and inhabit the new promised land. But the Israelites forgot the wondrous ways God had blessed them, and they failed to trust Him. This sorrowful account serves to help our young people learn that today, sin still separates us from His holiness, bringing sadness, regret, and destroyed relationships. Paul even used this history in his day, to encourage his audience not to sin against God as their ancestors had done. While he recounts the Israelites' failures, Paul reminds us, "...let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall." (I Cor. 10:12) We must never get over-confident and think we can resist sin on our own. Until we

humbly see a little of ourselves in God's weak and wayward people, we may not recognize the selfishness, pride, and obstinance in our own hearts. All our youth leaders treasure the mission of guiding our young people to see their need for our loving and merciful Savior.


