





I remember, while in Mobile attending meetings, a little incident occurred which I will relate. It was a beautiful evening, and just before the meeting some neighbors and myself were sitting on the front piazza enjoying the evening. One of the neighbors put one of his children upon a ledge eight feet high, and put out his hands and told him to jump. Without the slightest hesitation he sprang into his father's arms. Another child was lifted up, and he, too, readily sprang into the arms of his father. He picked up another boy, larger than the others, and held out his arms, but he wouldn't jump. He cried and screamed to be taken down. The man begged the boy to jump, but it was of no use; he couldn't be induced to jump. The incident made me curious, and I stepped up to him, and asked, "How was it that those two little fellows jumped so readily into your arms, and the other boy wouldn't?" "Why," said the man, "those two boys are my children, and the other boy isn't; he don't know me."

Father! Oh, what precious word is that.

Here is authority: "If I be a Father, where is mine honour?" If ye be sons, where is your obedience? The obedience which God's children yield to him must be loving obedience. Do not go about the service of God as slaves to their taskmaster's toil, but run in the way of his commands because it is your Father's way. Yield your bodies as instruments of righteousness, because righteousness is your Father's will, and his will should be the will of his child. **Father! -Here is a kingly attribute** so sweetly veiled in love, that the King's crown is forgotten in the King's face, and his sceptre becomes, not a rod of iron, but a silver sceptre of mercy - the sceptre indeed seems to be forgotten in the tender hand of him who wields it. Father! -**Here is honour and love.** How great is a Father's love to his children! That which friendship cannot do, and mere benevolence will not attempt, a father's heart and hand must do for his sons. They are his offspring, he must bless them; they are his children, he must show himself strong in their defense. If an earthly father watches over his children with unceasing love and care, how much more does our heavenly Father? Abba, Father! He who can say this, hath uttered better music than cherubim or seraphim can reach. There is heaven in the depth of that word-Father! There is all I can ask; all my necessities can demand; all my wishes can desire. I have all in all to all eternity when I can say, "Father."

What Condescension! (Penned by Faye Whittemore)

"Muse" or "Amuse"?

"My heart was hot within me, while I was musing the fire burned: then spake I with my tongue," – Psalm 39:3

The Psalmist was giving deep thoughts to the things of life and, while doing so, his heart burned within him. He was "musing" or deeply pondering the brevity and frailness of his life. Let us look at two words, "muse" and "amuse." When we consult Webster, we find the letter, "a" in "amuse", suggests a contrast in meaning in these two words. Webster defines "muse" as becoming "absorbed in thought, to think about something carefully and thoroughly." He defines "amuse" as having "one's attention engaged lightly." – A parsing of the word, when adding or subtracting the letter "a", would suggest the idea of a deep or a shallow thought.

We live in a time when more people are far more interested in "amusement" than "musing"! Understandably, amusement through wholesome entertainment may be productive in the matter of stress reduction, but amusement can become counterproductive when it consumes a person to the extent that it becomes a habitual method of denying reality!

The Psalmist, through musing, better understood life's brevity and frailty and his need of dependence upon the Lord for strength, deliverance, and direction. Muse through Psalm 39, acting upon its truths, and find for yourself that your heart, too, will become hot. Physical Life is short and frail and we desperately need salvation through Christ's provision on the cross. We daily need God's strength, deliverance, and direction. The perils of the times require more musing than amusing for reality is of such that we need God more than we realize!

June 14 is Flag Day ~ a day which is dear to our Pastor's heart. When I see the flag, I am reminded of the dangers our military personnel face, all in defense of that precious flag. Even though our Pastor faced personal danger as he served his country in Iraq, he maintained the ability to laugh in the moment, especially when laughing at himself!

"A Turtle Goes to the Johnny House" Chuck Peters, Chaplain 105th MP BN Camp Bucca Iraq, 2005

This morning I received the inspiration for this little story as I took my morning trip to one of the infamous Porta-johns dotting the landscape of my Army post in Southern Iraq. Our battlefield atmosphere requires that we wear body armor and Kevlar or helmet. This gear is very cumbersome, to say the least. The gear would probably weigh 40 pounds.













I had just returned from the shower facility and was wearing my standard Army P.T. shorts and tee shirt. I also was wearing the body armor. Try to capture the sight. A helmet, battle rattle, and me in shorts with my 58 year-old set of knobby knees sticking out. I was top heavy, ridiculous looking, and thinking to myself, I'm sure glad I'm 6,000 miles away from home! This attire is quite a contrast to my usual back home preacher "uniform" consisting of a suit and tie. I don't think I would want the picture as a part of our church



"Messenger" [Seriously, Pastor?] or framed on the wall alongside the former pastors of our church! I can hear the explosion of laughter in my sarcastic family and especially the high pitch laugh of Carol and her saying to me, "Don't make me laugh."

Most of us in our generation have fond memories of the little outhouse and the Sears magazine. I remember our family outhouse. The outhouse was necessary and a custom requirement. Everybody had them and personal property wasn't complete without them. A house and an outhouse went together then as naturally as an inside bathroom enhances the structure and comfort of a modern home.

This morning, as nature would have it, I needed to visit the Porta-john. I headed to the facility, wearing my P.T. shorts, body armor, and helmet. You have to try to picture the sight. You really look odd when you are short. The body armor has a flap that literally protects the front of the soldier's body. The flap hangs down quite low and reminds you of a disk on the back of a roto-tiller. The only difference is that this disk is on the front! Short soldiers almost plow a furrow as they walk and especially through this thick Iraqi desert sand. I struggle to get to the "John" and think in my mind that the hare in the nursery rhyme would have really loved to race this turtle!

I finally make it to the military version of the outhouse and once in, find that the place is too tight to remove the gear, so I have to negotiate the situation. I keep the gear on . . . Try to imagine a turtle sitting on a bathroom seat. Imagine that turtle also wearing a military helmet. That would make a good cartoon! That's what I looked like! My greatest fear was getting stuck in here! I can see the write-up now, "First Sergeant at Camp Bucca rescues the Battalion Chaplain from the Porta-john." I conclude this real life military story by simply saying that life can be funny even in difficult situations, and a little

humor brings relief to the tensions brought on by the pressures of life. We may as well throw in a little humor even on the battlefield. *Most of what we do is far from being laughable*.

We read in Proverbs, "A merry heart doeth good *like* a medicine: but a broken spirit drieth the bones." – Proverbs 17:22

As for me, I will continue making my way through this deployment and, yes, even spread a little humor as I go. There is always time for a good laugh, and especially when you see a turtle going to the Johnny house. [Thank you, Pastor, for your service!]
