

Be Strong ~ Youth

Our Wednesday nights have found our youngsters back at our Bible Timeline, where they have been excited to progress to the New Testament. So far, we have pondered the truth that Jesus is eternal, and that He spoke creation into existence long before He came as a tiny child... God in the

flesh, come to be our Savior. Now that we have explored the Old Testament, our students have caught a glimpse of Jesus in the prophecies, so it's clear to see why John claims Him as the "Word" come to life, God's precious promise in the flesh.

We have seen the baptism of Jesus, and heard His Father proclaim that He is the beloved Son, in Whom He is well pleased. We have also learned that the scriptures show how Jesus is perfectly holy, and uniquely qualified to be our Savior. In the wilderness, as He resists temptation from Satan, Jesus maintained His status as the sinless Bread of Life. What an example He leaves for us too! With all three attempts by Satan, Jesus confronts him with the words, "It is written"... then He uses scripture to counteract the blasts from the devil. The children were encouraged that we too might resist temptations, by standing on God's Word and claiming His truths. The Bible is our powerful weapon... the sword of the Lord is always ready to draw when we face Satan's tricks!

We saw too, how Jesus later revealed His power to Peter, James, and John. They witnessed the Lord's face glowing as the sun, and this transfiguration showed the majesty and glory of Jesus. His disciples would have no reason to doubt that Jesus was the one and only perfect Lamb of God, qualified to redeem the world! As we closely follow His ministry, we are also beginning to see how Jesus changed lives. A Samaritan who would've been scorned by other Jews, the woman at the well marveled that Jesus offered her "living water" that would spring up eternally. Amazed that He knew her sinful heart, she hurried to invite others to come and see Him for themselves. Jesus challenged the disciples to recognize the "harvest" to come, so they could "reap" the Samaritan people who then flowed out of the city, eager to learn more about the Lord. Jesus remained with them two days, and many believed on Him. From this account, our youngsters drew lessons for their own lives... that God's salvation is for everyone; and that we should go boldly for Him, like the woman at the well. Jesus had touched her, and she willingly went to spread the word! If He has touched us, we have a story to tell too, and we must share what Jesus has done in our lives. Because we know different people, we all have a different "harvest" we can reach. Thinking about those we love, it's a powerful motivator to insert individual names in the blank~"For God so loved that He gave His only begotten Son..."

While we weave our way through the Gospels, we will meet one person after another who encountered Jesus as He ministered here on earth. With every beautiful story, help us pray that each young heart will be touched by His redeeming love and forgiveness, growing ever closer to Him in their own walks with Christ.

Teen Update ~ We've started a new series with our teens in the book of Proverbs. This study will help our teens with practical instruction for claiming life as God intended for each of them to do. Our teens will come to understand wisdom and how to apply it in relationships, discipline, honesty, pride, emotions, and other vital areas in their life.

Our first lesson was titled, "Wisdom: Learning to Live Life with Skill." We discussed the differences between knowledge, intelligence, and wisdom. Proverbs encourages us as we live our lives, and it is God's collection of wisdom. Intelligence is our ability to learn, knowledge is the information storehouse of what we've learned, and wisdom is the understanding of life and how it all works. Wisdom is a skill at living life that is arrived at by understanding how life works. Wisdom comes from two sources: observation and divine inspiration.

Next, we examined ways to capture wisdom. Part of gaining wisdom is knowing how to recognize it. It doesn't just appear, or occur naturally. Wise people learn to be wise over time and have been highly valued throughout ancient history. The wise may not have been the smartest with the most knowledge, but they were skilled in living life and dealing with people. Kings sought wise men because they had taken the time to gain, learn, understand, receive, listen, and increase knowledge and obtain insight. These actions are given to us in Proverbs 1:1-7.

True Wisdom is based on the Fear of the Lord.

Finally, we looked at ways to lay a foundation of wisdom in our own lives. True wisdom is based on the fear of the Lord. Wisdom that is not based on this lacks depth that only the Lord can bring. We can observe life and learn to act wisely. By doing this, we can learn to avoid arguments, value our friendships, choose words more wisely, and discipline children. Anyone who is wise in these ways, but does not fear the Lord is missing a great deal. Their wisdom is about personal gain rather than respecting God.

When we live our lives by God's wisdom, our lives will be more pleasing to our Father in heaven.
