





This is a devotional series from **Pastor Chuck** which takes us through the alphabet each month.



W – "Walk" "(For we walk by faith, not by sight:)" – II Corinthians 5:7 The people of the world are governed by what they see. It's all about wealth, honor, splendor, praise, power, and things. The walk of sight is misguided by the lack of real wisdom.

The walk of sight is near sighted for it sees only the present and cannot see the irrelevance of power and possessions with eternity. It is amazing that so many are robbing and killing for things and kicking others aside to get to the top without once factoring in the fact, that Christ and the salvation He gives, is the greatest possession and will be all that really matters when we cross over into eternity!

The people of God are to walk by faith and to be governed by the things unseen. We live with joy, having full confidence that God is alive, real, and working on our behalf. We walk by faith believing that heaven is near and that this physical tabernacle of our earthly body is destined for a complete "makeover" of a new and glorified body when the Blessed Bridegroom comes in the rapture for His bride, the church. Our youngsters have begun the holiday season with our usual tradition of collecting shoebox gifts for Operation Christmas Child, and we're so grateful for the generosity of our church family again this year! We delivered eleven shoeboxes to a drop-off location in Oak Ridge, where we are always blessed to have several there hurry out to meet us and load your boxes on a cart! Before they

smiling workers hurry out to meet us and load your boxes on a cart! Before they wheel the gifts into the building, they join hands with us, circle our shoeboxes, and pray for the children who will be receiving them. It touches our hearts to think that, in a few short weeks, the gift you lovingly packed will be delivered to exactly the child who needs it. May God go before each gift, preparing every heart, so that the recipients might respond to the message of Christmas and ask Jesus to be their Savior. Thank you for being part of the amazing ministry carried out by Samaritan's Purse!

Moving along our Bible Timeline, we are seeing the last days of Jesus' life unfold. We made playdough figures, which we "brought to life" by adding a voice and personality. But John's eleventh chapter gives a whole new meaning to *life-giving* power. We saw Jesus delay his coming to the aid of his sick friend, Lazarus, so that "the Son of God might be glorified". Arriving after Lazarus had already died, Jesus met the weeping, grieving sisters and proclaimed, "I am the resurrection and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live." Our youngsters marveled to imagine a dead man walking out of the cave where he had been buried, beckoned by Jesus when he spoke, "Lazarus, come forth." How wonderful to ponder His power over death, and know that this scene was a glimpse into the days to come, when our Lord would step triumphantly from His own tomb.

Another night, we gave the students the chance to pretend they were famous celebrities, wearing sunglasses and having the red carpet rolled out for them as they arrived. As the "crowd," we squealed and swooned, pretending to take photos and plead for interviews. But looking at Luke's account of King Jesus entering Jerusalem, we were struck by the contrast... this was the Mighty Ruler of the Universe, coming into the city on a lowly little donkey, to show that He was bringing peace, not war. We were hurt to think of the tears He shed, knowing that this same crowd, waving palm branches and shouting hosannas, would reject Jesus and crucify Him in a matter of days.

Next, we looked at Mark's telling of the woman anointing Jesus with the costly contents of the alabaster box. It's hard for us to imagine, but it would've taken a year's work to afford the precious ointment she lavished on Him. To bystanders, it seemed wasteful, but we asked the children, "Is giving really a sacrifice if it doesn't hurt?" In giving her all, this woman was reflecting the deep sacrifice Jesus would soon give for us... our salvation cost Him His life's blood, spilled on a cruel cross. Sacrificial love hurts. He gave His best, so we should give Him *our* best... our time, our love, our gifts, our praise, our money, our lives. Christmastime is perfect for reminding our youngsters that Jesus left the glory of heaven to come and live among us; He came, born of a virgin and laid in a manger, knowing the cross would be His cost to bear. As we celebrate His birth once again, may we all bow in humble gratitude and thank Him for the sweetest sacrifice of all.

Teen Update As we proceed with our study of Proverbs, we have discussed how acquiring godly knowledge can facilitate family life. Everyone's life is better when everyone in the family is aware of their role. God is interested in the relationships we have with our family.

Everybody has gone through challenging relationships at some point in their lives. While some likely let go of these connections, others undoubtedly gave them their best. At the end of the day, we may be so worn out from the effort required to maintain these relationships with friends and classmates that we don't want to spend time with our family. God values families greatly, and when we disregard our familial bonds, we are unable to enjoy the lives that God has intended for us.

God created families from the beginning. Families are being attacked by Satan these days. God created the family as a means of educating, empowering, and supporting one another to live with the knowledge that we now refer to as wisdom. Every member of a healthy family communicates well with one another and leads an increasingly wise existence. Good communication occurs in families when member's value, discuss, and listen to one another.

We talked to our teenagers about how important it is for them to respect their parents. They must show them respect with their words, deeds, and reactions. It is their duty to respect their parents, absorb lessons from them, and realize that they are not in charge of their household. As their parents have previously seen life from their location and viewpoint, they will acquire wisdom from listening to them.

Lastly, there are a few ways that teenagers can make their parents happy. They can make them happy by demonstrating to them that they are growing in wisdom and learning new things. They can also show their parents that they are putting in a lot of effort and that they have learned from their mistakes by not making the same ones twice.

You can have a positive impact on your household if you choose with all of your heart to pursue God and Godly wisdom in matters pertaining to your family. We discussed the following verses for this lesson: Proverbs 17:6; 30:11-12, 17; 1:8; 4:1; 10:1; 15:20; 23:24

"O LITTLE TOWN OF BETHLEHEM" Luke 2:15

The shepherds responded to the announcement of the birth of the Saviour by saying, "...Let us now go even to Bethlehem, and see this thing which is come to pass,..." They came to Bethlehem and made the most glorious discovery in history! They beheld the most celebrated Person of all times. He was the babe lying in the manger.

When they saw this tiny babe, what were they seeing? They were seeing:

The Mystery Of Godliness – (I Timothy 3:16) In the manger lay an infant who was also the infinite. This feeble child was also the great Creator. God was manifested in human flesh. He was the One that Micah had prophesied would come. His "goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting." (Micah 5:2) At Bethlehem they say also:

The Manifestation Of Grace – Jesus came not to this world in a blaze of glory but as a babe. A babe is approachable! The message of the coming of this Redeemer initially came to the poor, the working class, and shepherds. Jesus is truly the manifestation of grace. He is approachable and His message to those who are weary and heavy laden down in sin is to "come" to Him. (Mat. 11:28) The shepherds also witnessed at Bethlehem:

The Moving Of Providence – God had directed Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem in fulfillment of prophesy. (Micah 5:2) They came to Bethlehem on a far more important mission than paying taxes! That mission is declared in this Text, "But when the fullness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law, to redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons." (Gal. 4:4-5)

The events of this year have been perplexing and "peace on earth" seems to be remote. Thank God, this One who came, and Whose birth we celebrate at Christmas will one day bring real peace to this earth! The key is to know Him as Saviour and to have that peace with God made possible by justification. (Rom.5:1)

HAVE A "MARY" CHRISTMAS Luke 1:46-47: 2:19

We are accustomed to saying "Merry Christmas," in an effort to convey our Christmas goodwill. We desire that others have a happy and wonderful Christmas. This standard greeting in the forms of words and cards is usually backed by good intentions. Webster defines "merry," as "being full of gaiety or high spirits."

Interestingly enough, Mary's spirit was truly high as she pondered the significance of the birth of her child. Notice her worship of this One that she would shortly birth into this World. "And Mary said, My soul doth magnify the Lord, And **my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour.**" (1:46-47) Could anyone doubt her "high spirit"? She knew that her womb was the tabernacle of the Son of God!

We read further in verse seven of chapter two, "And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn." She used her own hands to wrap her baby! She had just given birth yet personally wraps her child. I wonder if Jesus had Mary in mind when He said, "A woman when she is in travail hath sorrow, because her hour is come: but as soon as she is delivered of the child, she remembereth no more the anguish for joy that a man is born into the world." (John 16:21) Her joy over the Person and mission of her child overshadowed her travail in childbirth.

Notice this verse, "But Mary kept all these things, and pondered them in her heart." (Luke 2:19) Mary had the heart of a mother and the heart of a worshipper. Her mother's heart was a heart of love, warmth, and tenderness. She also possessed a heart of faith, devotion, and humility. She kept and weighed in her heart the truths concerning her Saviour, Son. She was a woman of faith, thoughtfulness, and discernment.

Christmas, 2023, will soon be here. Satan is mastering all of his forces to hinder a genuine celebration of the stupendous event of the birth of Christ. The subtle strategy of "political correctness" is hot on the burner of our humanistic society this Year. We are told that using the word, Christmas, may offend atheists and religionists who reject the Person and work of Christ. Christians are not to be ignorant of Satan's devices. The virgin birth of Christ, His finished work upon the cross, His bodily resurrection, ascension, and current position at the Father's right hand, assures the child of God that His work is totally complete.

I would suggest that we remind ourselves that Christmas is Christ. We need to worship Him as the Biblical approach to Christmas. Our Christmas priority must be a Christmas where our focus is upon the Person of Christ. Mary kept and pondered those things concerning Jesus Christ. Her spirit rejoiced in Christ her Saviour. Mary celebrated the first Christmas in a way that reveals the true way to celebrate the hallowed occasion.
