





**Y** – "Yet" "Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation." - Habakkuk 3:18 The reader will notice, in the context of the usage of the small three letter word "yet", the word "although", precedes

various woes. "Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines; the labour of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stalls:" - Habakkuk 3:17

Do you long to know the story behind Valentine's Day, hoping for a romantic tale about love and courtship? Well, legend has many stories about its origin, and none of them are romantic, or even pleasant! One such story goes thusly . . .

During the third century, Valentine was born in Rome. Later in life, he became a priest and then a bishop. He loved the Lord and preached the Christ of Christianity to everyone he encountered.

During that time, the emperor of Rome, Claudius II, wanted to end Christianity. So he outlawed Christianity and killed Christians. Claudius also waged war on many nations to make the kingdom of Rome larger. But he had a tough time recruiting soldiers. Why? He believed this was because men didn't want to leave their wives to go to battle. So, he outlawed marriage!

Valentine continued to preach about God. Whenever a Christian couple wanted to be married, he performed the marriage ceremony. Because of this, soldiers arrested and jailed Valentine.

Emperor Claudius liked Valentine and invited him to the palace many times to talk. Valentine knew that Claudius needed to ask Jesus into his heart and be saved. So Valentine talked to Claudius about Jesus often.

This made the emperor furious. He ordered Valentine to not mention Jesus again. Valentine knew Claudius would have him killed if he didn't stop talking about Jesus. But he also knew Claudius *needed* to hear about Jesus. So he made the decision to continue to share the Gospel with the emperor.

The emperor became so furious that he ordered Valentine to renounce his faith. Because Valentine wouldn't do that, Claudius gave orders to beat him with clubs. When Valentine still wouldn't renounce Jesus, Claudius ordered him stoned to death and beheaded. Valentine's burial occurred on February 14, which is now known as Valentine's Day.

#### Be Strong ~ Youth

Our "Be Strong" family wrapped up our year by sitting down and enjoying a meal prepared for us by Cheryl and Steve. It was a lovely way to wind down twelve months of growing together in the Lord, and a good time to look ahead to the blessings He will bring to our group in 2024.

We're thankful for the many chances we will have to serve Him and shine His light in the months to come.

Eager to return to the lessons that unfold on our Bible Timeline, our youngsters took one night to review the accounts of the gospels we've seen so far. What a blessing to see how much they remembered about the life of Jesus... His miracles, His teachings, and the events leading up to His betrayal.

On a recent night, we looked back at the timeline to consider the sacred night in Egypt, when Moses told God's people to brush the blood of a perfect sacrificial lamb onto the doorposts of their homes. The 12<sup>th</sup> chapter of Exodus tells of God's promise to the Israelites -- "When I see the blood, I will pass over you." And all the firstborn of God's people were spared as death passed across Egypt. Through the generations, the Jews remembered, keeping the ancient celebration of the Lord's goodness. And though centuries pass between Moses and Jesus, the significance of Jesus arriving in Jerusalem during the Passover celebration was not lost on our young people. They were excited to see how Jesus would take this special Passover meal and make it into a new covenant that would reflect the once-and-for-all sacrifice of God's perfect Lamb!

We talked about our senses, and how strongly they are tied to our memories. Lillie mentioned how certain songs help her recall special moments, and we discussed that scents and tastes also transport us back in time. The smell of pine trees, biscuits baking, or tropical sunscreen can instantly remind us of childhood Christmases, a beloved grandma, or family trips to the ocean. Knowing how the memories of our minds are triggered by our senses, Jesus sat down with His disciples at this Passover meal, leaving us with a powerful and tangible ordinance, meant to stir our remembrance of His sacrifice for us. At this Last Supper together, He broke the bread to show that His body would soon be broken, and He poured the wine to show that His precious blood would be spilled to pay sin's price for all mankind. As He served them, Jesus said, "This is My body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of Me." (Luke 22:19) Still today, we are called to observe this solemn and emotional tradition. Our youngsters quietly took crackers and grape juice, reverently focusing on our Savior and thanking Him for giving His life for us.

With that, we pondered the plotting going on behind the scenes of this first communion. Knowing the heartbreaking deed that Judas would soon carry out, Jesus still invited him to the Passover table along with the others. Aware that Judas was about to betray Him, Jesus still offered Judas the bread and the wine. Asked how they would've felt, the children said, "I'd want to throw Judas out." So, why didn't Jesus do that? "Because Jesus still loved him," was



their answer. In His longsuffering, Jesus wanted to give Judas every opportunity to change his mind and turn to Him. His love for us is beyond description. Jesus knows us thoroughly; He sees our weak and sinful ways, yet He invites us into His loving presence, and He is willing to make us new. What better reminder to encourage our souls in this season of love and candy hearts? May His abiding love and forgiveness draw you near, and comfort you all...

We thank you for the leadership Of great Presidents of the past. You used some to do Your will, And for You, they stood stedfast.



#### **Biblical Approach to Valentine's Day**

"Keep yourselves in the love of God..." (Jude 21)

Valentine's Day. The day is marked by expressions of love signaled with cards, chocolates, roses, and verbal expressions. Unfortunately, like so many other special days, we celebrate the day emotionally and restrict the celebration to a day event instead of a life event. We talk about the "spirit of Christmas." What about the "spirit of Valentine's Day?" The heart-shaped cards, rings, and boxes of chocolate are meant to say, "I love you."

The love in the home is enhanced by our relationship with the Lord. The bulk of marital issues has the underpinning of spiritual deficiencies. A proper devotional life is critical to the marriage relationship. I have noticed that the Christian who truly loves the Lord functions better in the various relationships of society.

We do not have to keep His love towards us. God's love is independent of our actions and attitudes. Praise the Lord! His love is pure and permanent. "Could we with ink the oceans fill And were the skies of parchments made, were every stalk on earth a quill And every man a scribe by trade, To write the love of God above Would drain the ocean dry; nor could the scroll contain the whole, Tho stretched from sky to sky." – (Lehman 188) [from "The Love of God"]

Jude reminds us that this "holding pattern" in keeping ourselves in the love of God requires that we feed our spiritual needs, keep warm our devotion, keep pure our affections, and keep bright our expectancy. The "keeping" is sandwiched between building, praying, and looking! .......Chuck Peters

Frederick Martin Lehman, 1868-1953 – Lehman emigrated from Germany to America with his family at age four, settling in Iowa, where he lived most of childhood. He came to Christ at age 11, as he relates: One glad morning about eleven o'clock while walking up the country lane, skirted by a wild crab-apple grove on the right and an osage fence, with an old white-elm gate in a gap at the left, suddenly Heaven let a cornucopia of glory descend on the eleven-year old lad. The weight of conviction was gone and the paeans of joy and praise fell from his lips.

Lehman studied for the ministry at Northwestern College in Naperville, Illinois, and pastored at Audubon, Iowa; New London, Indiana; and Kansas City, Missouri. The majority of his life was devoted to writing sacred songs.
