

Origins of April Fools' Day: Some historians speculate that April Fools' Day dates back to 1582, when France switched from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar. In the Julian Calendar, the new year began with the spring equinox around April 1. People who were slow to get the news or failed to recognize that the start of the new year had moved to January 1 and continued to celebrate it during the last week of March through April 1 became the butt of jokes and hoaxes and were called "April fools." Even in 1760 there was speculation as to the origins of the holiday, with a line in Poor Robin's Almanac reading: "The First of April some do say. Is set apart for all Fool's Day. But why the people call it so. Nor I nor they themselves do know."

Be Strong ~ Youth

Our youngsters have been looking forward to this final stretch of our Bible timeline, in which we explore the beginning of the early church. They were fascinated with the day of Pentecost, which took place ten days after Jesus ascended to heaven. The children colored flames and cut

them out, then they looked surprised when they were handed a piece of tape and instructed to slap them on their foreheads! In this funny setting, with paper flames stuck to our heads, we watched the Book of Acts unfold, amazed at the Holy Spirit's arrival as the Lord's church "catches fire" with a mighty rush of wind. Back then, the presence of God was *visible* in the flames above each believer's head, but He was also *heard...* in the miraculous way His truth was understood throughout Jerusalem that day, despite the language barriers. Our children marveled that Peter and John, filled with the Holy Spirit, were able to preach to thousands, each one hearing the gospel message in their own language! What a wonder, remembering that, as Christians, we too have His power... "But ye shall receive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you; and ye shall be witnesses unto me... unto the uttermost part of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Another night, we considered a variety of things that strike fear within our hearts. While we held up pictures of scary things, the children displayed their own fear-meters, holding up one finger for "no fear" and ranging all the way up to ten fingers for "terrified". Posted pictures included the ocean, vicious dogs, rollercoasters, heights, and bees – and each of us pondered the fears that will stop us in our tracks. We discussed what it might mean to have a "fear of God", and how He used an incident in Acts to remind His early church that His power should always be respected. Ananias and Sapphira had sold their property and donated a large part of the money to the church. Because they claimed that they had donated all of the money, they died instantly. It's important to understand that God doesn't require us to sell all we have and give it to his work. He knew this couple's hearts, and He saw the pride behind their lie... they wanted the others to be impressed with their great sacrifice, and they desired to be recognized for it. They strived for pleasing others instead of the Lord. In these early days when the church was brand new, God wanted His believers to be honest and humble before Him, having a desire to please only Him with their lives and honoring Him alone. While the news of their deaths spread, a healthy fear and regard for God's power grew in this first generation of church folks. Today, our respect for Him grows as we spend time in His Word, learning about Him and letting His truth lead our actions. When we live honestly before Him, He will bless us with His joy and peace.

We have also seen how the coming of the Holy Spirit gave boldness to the early believers to carry out miracles in the name of Jesus. When Peter and John encountered a lame man begging for money at the temple, they told him they had no silver or gold, but "such as I have give I thee: in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk." The man was healed, and went his way,

walking and leaping and praising God. Meanwhile, Peter boldly preached to the onlookers that it was through the power of Jesus, God's Son... the One they had crucified... that this lame man had been touched. Peter and John were thrown in prison and admonished to stop their preaching and healing, but they knew they could not help but "speak the things which we have seen and heard." With the Holy Spirit living within them, the men and women of Acts could face the task ahead as they spread the message of the gospel, knowing that Jesus was guiding the way. Thank you, church family, for praying that our own young Christians will also find the boldness they need to live for Christ... standing for His truth, and shining His light in everything they do.

Teens Update ~ Everyone could benefit from a little more self-control and diligence in their lives. Idleness breeds boredom. As our study of Proverbs progresses, we see how God counsels us to live disciplined and diligent lives. Although labor has existed since the beginning of time, the society in which we currently live attempts to persuade us that when we are free from labor, we have achieved true success.

"And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the Garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it," according to Genesis 2:15. Here we see that God had already worked out his plan before Adam and Eve rebelled. What a job it must have been to care for and direct God's creation! Though the labor here would not have been as frustrating as in today's modern gardens, it would still have required labor and sweat. Although challenging, work is essential for us.

God values hard work. The curse that followed Adam and Eve's fall is not work per se. Rather, the curse is that the land will make it difficult for man to put food on the table and that work will be hard. Work is not a curse in and of itself. Proverbs 24:30–34 describes a lazy life, according to Soloman. God has always valued skillful and good labor. Moses told the people in Exodus 36:1, "Then wrought Bezaleel and Aholiab, and every wise hearted man, in whom the LORD put wisdom and understanding to know how to work all manner of work for the service of the sanctuary, according to all that the LORD had commanded." When Jesus was here on earth, he wasn't a loafer, he grew up learning his father's trade in carpentry and wood work.

Godly qualities include self-control and hard work. Living with a healthy respect and fear of God is our life's work. This mission should motivate us to be thorough and disciplined in everything we do!

I am excited to report that we have reached several of our financial goals as we close 2023 and enter 2024. God has brought men and women, churches, and foundations to fund His work of teaching His faithful servants to "rightly divide" and proclaim His good news! You have heard the need, and you have given to meet that need.

In 2023, one of our goals was to develop a strategy to tell "our story" - the amazing account of how God has established BEN and National Theological College and Graduate School. God has opened an effectual door to send the gospel into restricted access countries of the Middle East and theologically needy areas of East Africa. While God has called men and women to salvation, dedication, and ministry in these areas, they have limited, to no access to theological training or resources. Like Apollos of Acts, they have a zeal without knowledge. They lack the training to effectually preach and teach the pure and powerful gospel. The need for theological training is great.

God is using His people to make this training possible. As one of our former presidents at BEN has said, "The water of life is free, but the plumbing is very expensive." You are providing the "plumbing" needed to shower the water of life in these driest areas of our world.

In the last newsletter, we mentioned the need for Student Scholarships (SAS), and your generosity has supplied the need. We also mentioned Translation and Printing (TAP) projects: **Book to Translate for TAP Project**:

The World and the Word: An Introduction to the Old Testament. Needed \$15,500; Received \$15,500; Remaining \$ - 0 -

Arabic Theological Dictionary. Needed \$2,750; Rec'd \$1,350; Remaining \$1,400

Proverbs: A Mentor Commentary. Needed \$11,600; Rec'd \$2,000. Remaining \$9,600.

Thank you for sharing your resources with BEN and NTCGS. Without your generous gifts, there would be many who would be sounding an "uncertain trumpet" without the training and resources they need to interpret and herald God's Word.

<u>Note:</u> Because of the unrest in Lebanon and the surrounding countries, the courses for the Lebanese and Syrian students were taught remotely in the fall and will also be online this spring. They include Biblical Counseling and Introduction to the Old Testament. Please pray for our professors to teach God's Word clearly and effectively. Pray for our students to learn and live what they study.
