





Memorial Day in the USA

...is celebrated on the last Monday in May ~ May 27, 2024.

All men and women, who gave their lives while serving in the United States Armed Forces, are commemorated on this day. National Memorial Day is formally known as Decoration Day, the day that commemorated the Union and Confederate soldiers, who died during the American Civil War. Later the day extended to honor all American soldiers, who died while in the military service.

Traditionally, the flag of the USA is raised briskly to the top of the flagstaff, then it is lowered to the half-staff position. This position is chosen in remembrance of those individuals who died for their country. At noon the flag is raised to full-staff as the symbol that the memory of dead soldiers is being raised by the living. Their sacrifice was not in vain, that is why we rise up in their honor and continue fighting for liberty and justice.

Be Strong ~ Youth

As we continue to explore the Book of Acts, our youngsters are amazed by the ways the early church grew and spread, despite the enemy's attempts to squelch it. In the midst of persecution, the apostles learned to see suffering for Jesus as a privilege. We thought about our "worst gift"

ever... a single sock, an empty Coke bottle. While it might be difficult to find the good in a prison stay or a beating, we are seeing that suffering for Christ's sake is a gift and an honor. We were amazed by the strength of the apostles thrown into prison, but the account of Stephen stopped our young people in their tracks. We saw how the Holy Spirit led and empowered Stephen to preach before the Sanhedrin, boldly telling them they had rejected their Messiah and killed Him on a cross. We marveled at Stephen's bravery to obey God even though it put him in extreme danger, then we sorrowed to read that Stephen was dragged away and stoned. But what a glorious moment when Stephen looked up and saw Jesus by the Father's throne, knowing he would soon be with Him for eternity! Though the Jewish leaders were attempting to stop the spread of the gospel, Stephen's death instead lit a fire that sparked the early Christians to shine Christ's light more than ever. Also in this chapter of Acts, a man stood by, holding the robes of the men who attacked Stephen; and our children were intrigued when we told them to keep their eyes on this man named Saul... his incredible story would continue in our next lesson.

We prepared our hearts for the ninth chapter of Acts by hunting for hidden items in a colorful puzzle page. Sometimes we believe we're seeing things clearly, but it wasn't easy to spy the things we were looking for. Saul must have also believed his vision was perfect, thinking he was doing God a favor, as he hunted down Christians and tried to end this movement called "the Way". But Saul was spiritually blind, and as he made his way to Damascus to seek and arrest believers, the Lord helped him see the Light. Right there on the road, Saul fell to the ground under the intense light, as Jesus Himself asked the question, "Why persecutest thou Me?" Struck blind, Saul waited in Damascus for three days until Ananias, guided by God, came by to touch him and restore his sight. Saul's conversion was a living testimony of the Lord's transforming power. He truly became a new man; so much so that he even changed his name to Paul. Our youngsters are eager to explore the plans God had for him in carrying the gospel afar.

We are also pondering the ways our suffering impacts others. When Stephen lost his life for the sake of Jesus, he was filled with joy and peace, in the midst of the brutal violence against him. No doubt, the scene pricked the heart of Paul as he stood by, holding robes. When Jesus told him that it was hard for him to kick against the pricks, he meant that Paul had been resisting the nudge of the Holy Spirit, just as oxen might stubbornly ignore the prodding of the farmer's stick guiding them in the field. Witnessing Stephen's sacrifice began to melt Paul's heart. We likewise never know how our own trials might influence others. When they see us trusting Jesus despite hardship,

and displaying peace in the midst of turmoil, they know something is different about us, and that gives the Holy Spirit an open door to touch the hearts of onlookers. Paul would later say, "For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on Him, but also to suffer for His sake." (Philippians 1:29) Help us pray for our young people, that they will develop a proper perspective of suffering for Jesus. Though it may seem an unlikely gift, making a sacrifice for Him is a privilege that may lead others to see our loving Savior in us.


On April 14, 2024, Pastor Chuck Peters preached his last sermon as senior pastor of the Smith Grove Baptist Church. At that time, he was graced with the title, *Pastor Emeritus*. "Pastor Emeritus" signifies being retired from active pastoral service while retaining one's title as an honor. The title is offered because of merit earned during the time of active service. *The honor is never an automatic one but rather is a recognition of exceptional service*.

The Summit of True Spirituality

The Apostle Peter was once questioned about his love for Christ, after his denial. He would later write on the subject for he, personally, had experienced the extension of love from the One he denied. He wrote: "Whom having not seen, ye love; in whom, though now ye see him not, yet believing, ye rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory:" – I Peter 1:8

I have chosen this verse as my life's verse for I have come to believe that its truths epitomize a genuine and lofty spiritual testimony of the highest order. Peter references the responsive love of the child of God to the Lover of their soul. The physical absence of the Saviour does not dampen that love, for the Holy Spirit within, magnifies the glories of the risen Saviour and the quickened heart responds with love. That love relationship with the Lord bolsters the faith and the love-faith connection, and results in unspeakable joy!

What is the best gauge of genuine spirituality? Is the gauge fanfare, endless activity, and mere religion? Is it the holding of offices in the local church, the giving of large sums of money to missions, or the holding of respectable titles? The summit of true spirituality is a personal love relationship with Christ, for that relationship alone, brings about a walk of faith, unspeakable joy, and fullness of glory. It is wonderful to know that a Christian may be lacking in abilities and talents, yet, they are enabled, by the Holy Spirit, to have a love relationship with the Lover of their soul! We now have complete authority and access to all the public schools in Kenya, including colleges, universities, high schools, and elementary public schools. God is good! We had our first team to go into a university in Kenya recently. The gospel of our wonderful Lord and His mercy is going into the education units of the country as I write. PLEASE PRAY!

Many people have responded financially in helping us finance the printing of the Christian literature we have been giving out. To date, we have given approximately 60,000 copies to high schools and elementary public schools. Many of you should have received a book called "A Place Called Heaven" and also a copy of "The Gospel Coloring Book" for the elementary students in recent weeks. This is the literature God allowed me to write for Kenya. If you did not get these booklets, please call me, and I will send them to you: (336) 813-5166.

We thank God for everyone who has helped us financially. We are right now in need of financing for the printing of 15,000 more. Several more have committed to supporting a team of four Kenyan Independent Baptist Preachers for \$190 per month for all four. This will allow them to go into the schools on a full-time basis, preaching to several thousand young people every week, sharing the gospel. Not one dollar is used for any other purpose than printing and supporting teams. I personally have not gotten one dollar from the support for the 60,000 copies already given out. And I will not in the future. Thank you for all you are doing to reach Kenyans for Christ. We will need a stream of money to publish future literature. The Kenyans say it's the best tool they have had in 30 years.
