





~ Pain, Adversity, Delays ~ Excerpt from a lesson by Calvin Vaughn

Pain, Adversities and Delays can be so discouraging! Yet God will use them to cut fleshly habits and attitudes from our life. That allows us to grow in Christlikeness. John 15:1-5 KJV I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman. Every branch in me that beareth not fruit he taketh away; and every branch that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit. Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me. I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.

Let's look at a vineyard or orchard in Fruitland, North Carolina (northeast of Hendersonville) in apple country, where many farmers have apple orchards. Once a Pastor stopped by to visit one of them; he found the farmer mercilessly cutting branches from one of the trees.

He told the Pastor that to produce an abundant crop of the best fruit, he had to prune the branches. It might look as if the tree was going to die, but new growth would spring from the wounds.

This conversation helps us understand why the Lord sometimes uses His pruning knife in our lives. To get a plentiful crop of spiritual fruit, He must remove anything that hinders us from becoming the person He designed us to be.

We may have experienced such pruning or we may know of a family or Church member experiencing something like this. We should pray for each other, especially when we or others are facing adversities, pruning or delays in our/their spiritual walk with Christ. A good question for each of us is how do we respond.

This is part of being disciplined. Not many of us like this part of life but it is necessary. The process is often painful as God cuts away fleshly habits and worldly attitudes, but His pruning results in us becoming a more accurate reflection of Jesus Christ. Hopefully we can develop an attitude of gratitude as we walk down this difficult pathway.

Sometimes we tend to blame God, a spouse, a friend or a coworker for these trials of life. Unfortunately, such times of adversity can be stressful. Life sometimes causes us to feel like a rubber band stretched tight. Pressures build up and pull us in different directions or pull against our sense of well-being.

What is the answer? We need a perspective that comes only from God. We must be willing to surrender our rights and ways to God. We must stop telling God how to answer and ask God What He wants us to do or not do!

One of the hardest things for us to bear is not having control over our own circumstances. But as Christians, this is exactly how we are called to live. Jesus made this very clear when He said we must deny ourselves and lose our life for His sake. Luke 9:23-24 And he said to them all, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me. For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: but whosoever will lose his life for my sake, the same shall save it.

WHAT IS YOUR ANSWER to the question of the day: Is God absent in my times of pain and trouble? Rest assured Promises from God will sustain and encourage you: **PSALM 31:7** *I* will be glad and rejoice in your unfailing love, for you have seen my troubles, and you care about the anguish of my soul.

Be Strong ~ Youth

Our youngsters have been excited to return to our Bible Timeline, where we're watching more of Paul's missionary journeys unfold. Before opening to the eighteenth chapter of Acts, we built a tower of blocks, then carefully pulled away a block at a time, until our tower toppled. While in Ephesus and Corinth, Paul and his companions

shared the powerful Word of God with people in darkness, resulting in the *top-pling* of their pagan beliefs. The power of the gospel starts a life-changing chain reaction, and we learned that nothing could stop the widespread growth of Christ's church!

We met Aquila and Priscilla, as well as Apollos. And we saw Paul help some magicians realize that only Jesus could help them cast out evil spirits. They trusted in the Lord, then burned their wicked magic books. The idol-making silversmiths of Ephesus were making a fortune until their sales dropped, a direct result of Diana worshipers turning to Jesus! So next, we witnessed Paul sparking a riot in this pagan city where the temple of Diana was so grand that it was considered one of the seven wonders of the ancient world! We even looked at a picture of the temple's ruins today. Why did the temple of this mythical goddess topple and fall to the ground like our block tower? Because God's power proved unstoppable, and in those days of the early church, when Jesus was growing the faith, He used Paul and other believers to spread His truth throughout the world. In our time, too, we can be assured that our Savior will give us the strength and ability to share His message of redemption with others.

Looking at a picture of the remarkable Angel Oak Tree in Charleston, we pondered its age. Most scholars say it could be as many as 1500 years old! No one can be sure of its origin, but long ago, a little acorn germinated and took hold, deeply spreading roots and growing more with each passing year. Similarly, the seed of the gospel was planted over 2000 years ago, and our heavenly Father has seen to it that the message of His beloved Son put down deep roots, and it has never stopped spreading and growing... "So mightily grew the Word of God and prevailed." (Acts 19:20) As a reminder of this, we each took a sharpie and wrote, "MIGHTILY" on our acorn souvenirs. This season of autumn may seem somber to some, with its dying leaves, withering greenery, and dry, browning landscapes. In many ways, it feels like an ending, a sorrowful time of dying. But don't lose hope, dear church family... somewhere in the rich and musty forest floor, a faithful little acorn is taking hold and beginning to grow into a mighty oak tree. The faith sprouting in the young hearts of our youth is a treasure we cherish. We are so grateful for the many missions rooted in our long Smith Grove history. Those strong ministries span generations, and they are the sturdy foundation on which we are building today's ministries. In October especially, we are deeply mindful of the parts every single one of you plays in reaching others for Jesus. Our ministries rely on yours, and we truly appreciate the blessing of serving Him along with each one of you precious coworkers...

Smith Grove Baptist Church ~ Established 1921

In 1921, the Reverend Nealis Smith of Kernersville, North Carolina, held a meeting under a brush arbor located near the present church building. From this meeting, a church was organized. With the pastor and most of the charter members being Smiths, "Smith Grove Baptist Church" was born. The first church building was erected in 1923.

Clint Smith (father to Wade Smith, missionary) donated the first organ to the church, and Ruby Nuckles and Cora Pendry were the first organists. Tom Ballard, Grover Farrington, "Big" Jim Nuckles, Green Pendry, Drew Smith, and Bob Westmoreland were the first deacons. Among the first Sunday School teachers were Maude Smith and Dovie Clark.

In 1928, the Reverend Richard 0. Nuckles was called to be the pastor. A new building was begun on July 4, 1952, with Pastor Nuckles doing most of the construction himself. The first service was Saturday night prayer meeting on April 30, 1955 with Reverend James Brown, speaker. There were 178 in attendance at the first Sunday service.

Reverend T.L. Sasser and Reverend Luther Naul (Burlington NC) spoke at a dedication service on June 19, 1955. The first wedding in the new church was Lala Kathleen Briles to George Harvey Pitts on February 5, 1956. Also in 1956, Ruby Nuckles, Nesbit Smith, Ray Campbell, and Margie Campbell were the first to be baptized in the church baptistery.

In May, 1956, the church voted to help support the Reverend and Mrs. Harlan E. Willis and family to go to Alaska as the first missionary outreach. In November, 1959, Mr. Charles R. Lambreth of Greensboro, N.C., put chimes in the church in memory of his mother, and in January, 1960, Mr. W. M. Bruton from Asheboro, NC painted the baptistery picture.



Ben Farrington, Bill Johnson, Delas Long, Walter Westmoreland, Cordell McCollum, Johnny Long, David Ward, Clint Nuckles, Eddie Thomason, and Bruce Freeman were among the preachers called out of the church. Reverend Wade Smith and family (Nora and Jonathan), are the first missionaries to be called out of Smith Grove (ministering to the Armed Forces Personnel in Virginia Beach, Virginia).

C.B. "Boot" Westmoreland served as choir director from 1947 to 1983. Curt Bame became choir director in 1983 (Dennis Westmoreland, Assistant) and served for many years. Mike McCollum then served in that position for more than twenty years. Jim Laramore is our current choir director, with Charlene Tester, pianist; Joy Vaughn, assistant pianist, and

H.B. Clegg, organist.

Due to declining health, Reverend Nuckles preached his final sermon on December 22, 1968, after 40 years of service. At that time, Reverend Ward Laramore was called to be the pastor. Under his ministry, Smith Grove Baptist Church continued to stand strong as a thriving beacon of hope in the community, with beliefs grounded and rooted in the fundamentals of God's Word. Reverend Laramore served until 1998, having completed 30 years as Smith Grove's pastor.

Dr. Charles "Chuck" Peters became pastor in 1998, and along with his wife Carol, he continued the "true to the gospel" heritage established a century ago. He retired in April, 2024, after more than 25 years as pastor.

Reverend Bruce Freeman pastored Manna Baptist Church in Walkertown for eight years, and in 2017, he was called back home to Smith Grove to serve as Associate Pastor. On April 15th, 2024, with wife Darla at his side, he became the Senior Pastor of Smith Grove Baptist Church, only the fifth pastor to serve in the 103 year history of the church.
