As we continue down our Bible Timeline, our young people are eagerly soaking up the truths laid out for us while we follow Paul on his missionary journeys. We played a game of *Will it Float?*, dropping random household items into a bowl of water. We experimented with attaching the buoyant things to the "sinkers" to see if

they could stay afloat. In life, we are often just treading water and it sometimes feels as though we're drowning in our troubles, but Paul reminds us that the Lord's grace is a sturdy life raft that keeps us from sinking.

We witnessed Paul being arrested in Jerusalem, wrongly accused of bringing a Greek into the temple. Even when the mob ganged up on him, Paul was still sharing his testimony of salvation. A Roman commander held Paul in the barracks for his safety, and through the night, Jesus Himself came to encourage him, saying that Paul would soon carry the gospel to Rome! Each time he came before the leaders of the day... Governor Felix, King Agrippa, and Festus... Paul always preached Christ and shared his personal story of accepting Jesus as his Savior. While in Caesarea, Paul appealed to come before Caesar himself, setting his sights on getting all the way to Rome and taking the gospel with him. On one leg of the journey, despite Paul's warnings, their boat set sail from Crete and was soon threatened by a storm so violent that the crew lost hope of surviving. But Paul told them an angel had promised that no one on board would die. In the turbulent waves, the ship was torn apart, but the crew and prisoners clung to the pieces of wood and drifted to the island of Malta. God used the devastation of a shipwreck to show His power and His mercy on them all. Stranded, Paul left the natives marveling when he survived a snake bite while he was gathering firewood. As God protected him yet again, Paul was a witness for Christ, healing and touching the sick on the island.

Once he finally reached Rome, Paul spent two years under house arrest, influencing Roman leaders while he wrote letters to the young Christians in the churches he had planted on his journeys: Philippians, Ephesians, Colossians, Philemon. Throughout many perils, faithful Paul was used by God in mighty ways, and the gospel of Jesus was brought to Europe at last. To the church in Corinth, Paul wrote, "Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake; for when I am weak, then am I strong." It seems the longer we live, the more we confirm this truth. Even in the midst of suffering, we still endure with joy in our hearts. Through the storm, Jesus keeps us floating, and we can rejoice because He gets all the glory. Please help us pray that our youngsters will learn that, in this troubled life with its stormy seasons, His grace is always enough.

"Giving Thanks Always For All Things..." Ephesians 5:20

Thanksgiving is not confined to a day but rather should be the daily exercise of the Christian. The verse says, "Always." God is always blessing us and those blessings are apparent regardless of the straits and stresses of life. Paul happened to be a prisoner when he wrote these words! "He who looks only on his trials will soon find his mind soured and complaining; he who endeavors to find how many occasions for gratitude he has, will soon find the burden of his sorrows alleviated, and his mind tranquil and calm." (Barnes 107)

The word "gratitude" comes from the same root word for "grace." We have all received abundant grace. We should show abundant gratitude. "Think" and "thank" are two words coming from the same root word. We would be more thankful if we would be more thoughtful. We need to ponder often the mercies of God. We should continually give thanks for His sufficient grace.

I recently preached on the subject of the sufficient grace of God and penned the following:

"Once I was A Sinner, lost and Undone;

Now I am Adopted, a Child, and a Son.

Once I Was Condemned and A Servant to Sin;

Now I Am Redeemed and Accepted In Him.

Once It Was Death, Turmoil and Strife;

Now It Is Joy, Peace and Life.

That Grace Still Abounds and Is Sufficient for Me."

Does God Expect Christians to Vote?

It is our contention that it is the duty and responsibility of every Christian to vote and to vote for leaders who promote Christian principles. God is most certainly in control, but that does not mean we should do nothing to further His will. We are commanded to pray for our leaders (1 Timothy 2:1-4). In terms of



politics and leadership, there is evidence in Scripture that God has been displeased with our choices of leadership at times (Hosea 8:4). The evidence of sin's grip on this world is everywhere. Much of the suffering on earth is because of godless leadership (Proverbs 28:12). Scripture gives Christians instructions to obey legitimate authority unless it contradicts the Lord's commands (Acts 5:27-29; Romans 13:1-7). As born-again believers, we ought to strive to choose leaders who will be themselves led by our Creator (1 Samuel 12:13-25). Candidates or proposals that violate the Bible's commands for life, family, marriage, or faith should never be supported (Proverbs 14:34). Christians should vote as led through prayer and study of both God's Word and the realities of the choices on the ballot.

Christians in many countries in this world are oppressed and persecuted. They suffer under governments that they are powerless to change and governments that hate their faith and silence their voices. These believers preach the gospel of Jesus Christ at the risk of their own lives. In the U.S.A., Christians have been blessed with the right to speak about and choose their leaders without fearing for themselves or their families. In the U.S.A., in recent elections, about 2 of every 5 of self-professed Christians took that right for granted and did not vote. About 1 in 5 self-professed, eligible Christians are not even registered to vote.

In our day and age, there are many who want to drive the name and message of Christ completely out of the public arena. Voting is an opportunity to promote, protect, and preserve godly government. Passing up that opportunity means letting those who would denigrate the name of Christ have their way in our lives. The leaders we elect – or do nothing to remove – have great influence on our freedoms. They can choose to protect our first amendment right to religious freedom and the right to spread the gospel, or they can restrict those rights. They can lead our nation toward righteousness or toward moral disaster. As Christians, we should stand up and follow our command to fulfill our civic duties (Matthew 22:21).

The Importance of Giving Thanks

Have you ever Turned Back when Serving the Lord?

Webster defines the act of turning back as: to go in the reverse direction or to stop going forward. Is turning back a POSITIVE or NEGATIVE action?

Numerous Scriptures shed light on this as seen in **Luke 5:12-14** And it came to pass, when he was in a certain city, behold <u>a man full of leprosy</u>: who seeing Jesus fell on his face, and besought him, saying, Lord, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. And he put forth his hand, and touched him, saying, I will: be thou clean. And immediately the leprosy departed from him. <u>And he charged him to tell no man: but go, and shew thyself to the priest,</u> and offer for thy cleansing, according as Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them.....He obeyed and went to the Priest as Jesus commanded.

We find the story of 10 OTHER LEPERS in Luke 17:11 - And it came to pass, as he went to Jerusalem, that he passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee. :12 - And as he entered into a certain village, there met him ten men that were lepers, which stood afar off :13 - And they lifted up their voices, and said, Jesus, Master, have mercy on us. 14 - And when he saw them, he said unto them, Go shew yourselves unto the priests. And it came to pass, that, as they went, they were cleansed: :15 And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God, 16 And fell down on his face at his feet, giving him thanks: and he was a Samaritan. 17 And Jesus answering said, Were there not ten cleansed? but where are the nine?

Did Christ command these **10 LEPERS** to do anything? NO! So, what did they do? Let's look at verse 15 again ~ **15 And** one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, and with a loud voice glorified God.

As we see in this verse, **only one of the lepers GLORIFIED GOD** when he turned back! The other nine were complacent: *Complacent according to Webster is displaying a smug attitude!*

Speaking of attitudes, do they affect your testimony? **YES**. Can attitudes affect your commitment to live a Christian life? Can negative attitudes change the direction of your life? **YES**

As born again believers, we must strive to Glorify God in our every action, reaction, word and deed. In other words, seek to have an **Attitude of Gratitude** as seen in verse **17:** And Jesus answering said, Were there not ten cleansed? but where are the nine?

How often do we have an Attitude of Gratitude? Do we take God's Provisions for granted. Do we just get in our car or truck, turn the key or push the power button and away we go!

I'm afraid we do that too often because we believe God owes us His Blessings. Actually, God owes us nothing! For the most part we have turned our

backs to God and His free gift, blessings and provisions. Rom 3:23 - For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;

Let's stop and think for a minute about our prayer life. What does God hear? Is it all gimme gimme, got got? Or could it be, *Thank you*, *Lord*, *for Your Blessings on me*. Do our prayers consist of "Dear God, please give me this or that" or are they, "Dear God, thank you for the prayers you have answered and for the provisions I never prayed about!"

Let's look in Psalms 145 where David tells us that we need to display more thankfulness! Actually we should be thanking Him more instead of asking Him for more. Our thanksgivings for mercy should even exceed our supplications. Supplications are simply the prayers asking God for something!

Psalm 145:6-7 And men shall speak of the might of thy terrible or awesome acts: and I will declare thy greatness. They shall abundantly utter the memory of thy great goodness, and shall sing of thy right-eousness.

How often do you get up of a morning and thank Him for a place to sleep, eat and learn of God's mercy and goodness to you? Have you found your life being similar to your **automobile? Think about the transmission**. Is it an automatic? In other words, do we simply open our eyes, rise and shine, put on our clothes and away we go.

How do we let the world know that we're a new creation through Christ Jesus our Lord & Savior?

2 Cor. 5:17 - Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.
 All of these men that we have examined made a turn in their lives. Those with thanksgiving in their hearts, turned to the Savior with an attitude of gratitude.
