



National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day ~ Each year on December 7, Pearl Harbor Survivors, veterans, and visitors from all over the world come together to honor and remember the 2,403 service members and civilians who were killed during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. A further 1,178 people were injured in the attack, which permanently sank two U.S. Navy battleships (the USS Arizona and the USS Utah) and destroyed 188 aircraft. On August 23, 1994, the United States Congress designated December 7 as National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day. Every year, remembrance events are held at the Pearl Harbor National Memorial.





"Rejoice in the Lord." The season for joy is stated in the word, "alway." The priority of joy is seen in the final words in the verse. "and again I say, Rejoice." I also would add that "Rejoice" is capitalized!





**President's Perspective...** A message from David H. Snyder, President ~ Baptist International Missions, Inc.

The Apostle Paul asked for prayer that the word of the Lord would have free course, and be glorified (2 Thessalonians 3:1). It is important that we pray about this regularly since Satan is working continually to restrict the proclamation of the Gospel. Sometimes the Lord uses tools like medical missions to open doors, allowing His Word to have free course. Such is the case in the following account given by Kristine McLaughlin, BIMI Medical Missionary serving in Côte d'Ivoire.

When one arrives in a new village, we as missionaries have learned through the years that it is important to present ourselves to the village chief. We arrived, asked around, and were directed to his house. We met with the chief along with his nobility. They welcomed us





warmly. To our great surprise and delight, the chief asked if one of our men could preach. I had a couple of deacons with me. Our head deacon preached. They asked for a second preaching session and then a third. All of which our men were glad to deliver. Our hearts could not have been more touched. In my 15 years of ministry here in Ivory Coast, I have never seen this level of openness from a chief during an initial meeting. At the end of our time together, he thanked us sincerely and said, "We are thirsty for this Word. We will be watching the road for when you come back."

I praise the Lord for how He is working around the world through faithful missionaries like Kristine. The Word of God is being proclaimed and It will never return void. Thank you for your support of missionaries who are seeking to glorify God by entering the doors He is opening in Africa and the rest of the world. May the LORD richly bless you!
