





It is with a grateful heart I want to say thank you for your continuous prayer and financial support through this past year. In spite of Cuba's last hurricane, Rafael, that completely destroyed the church building in San Juan, the worship services continue under the makeshift tarpaulin roof. Having power in Cuba continues to be a struggle as the power suddenly goes off for hours at a time.

Our latest mission outreach was truly blessed. Our mission team consisted of 122 missionaries that traveled from different parts of Cuba to join us. We continued our ministry work visiting people from house to house. We had the rare opportunity to speak to three Jehovah's Witnesses, which were very reluctant to hear God 's message. Nevertheless, I continued sharing the Gospel and two of them accepted Christ.

In one of our evening services, a 12 year old boy raised his hand and asked what happens after we die. I asked him if he knew what sin is and if he believed he was a sinner. I asked if he would like to ask Jesus to forgive him and he said yes.

In January, I will be going to the Ukraine to preach to the soldiers and refugees, as well as provide humanitarian aid. Numerous mission trips are planned for Cuba. We ask that you pray for these upcoming trips.

Be Strong ~ Youth

With great anticipation, our younger Bible students are quickly moving down the last stretch of our Timeline. After years of looking back on the past, through the events of the Old and New Testaments, we are now seeing future events unfold before us! Having just left Paul, Peter, and all the other early church heroes, our kids were a

little surprised that we are still living in the same "Church Age" 2000 years later. Isn't it amazing that the early believers watched for Jesus to return for them in the clouds, the same way we do? In his day, Paul gave the church of Thessalonica a peek at the expected rapture of the saints to come: "For the Lord Himself shall descend from heaven... and the dead in Christ shall rise first: then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up... to meet the Lord in the air." (I Thess. 4:16-17) We looked at the sounds associated with this great event... the Lord's shout, the voice of an angel, and the sound of a trumpet. And we discovered that God's children will stand before the throne of Jesus, to receive rewards for the ways we served Him in this life. The children marveled that we will lay these treasures at His throne, in His honor. They agreed that it is only fitting... if not for Jesus and His sacrifice, we wouldn't even have the blessing of spending eternity with Him. And how could we have the boldness to serve God here on earth, if the Holy Spirit didn't empower and encourage us in our service? Indeed, our beloved Savior is worthy of all our praise and glory!

This glimpse into our eternal future gives our youngsters hope and joy, knowing that Jesus will return for us, as promised. But this destiny should help drive us rather than distract us. We must live each day realizing that our time is short. Sometimes, we struggle teaching children about death or end times, as we never want to frighten or cause an anxious urgency in their young hearts. So, we appreciated the approach our lesson guide used to introduce these delicate future events. Each student was given a paper crown cut-out to color, design, and decorate to their hearts content. "You only have a short time though", they were told. "At any moment, I'll call 'time' and you'll have to lay down your markers." Harkened straight from those school days of dreaded pop guizzes and timed multiplication tables, there was that heavy air of anxiety and uncertainty as they frantically tried to use their "crown time" wisely, not knowing exactly how long they had to work. When I called, "Time!", there were the expected frustrated sighs and long faces. We talked about the way the abrupt end made them feel, and if they wished they could've worked faster. The takeaway was "You didn't know your time limit, but I did." Likewise, Jesus lovingly holds all our days, and He has given us the precious opportunity to earn a crown as we serve Him in this life — "We don't know our time limit, but He does." Rather than scare us, paralyze us, or stop us in our tracks, may this realization inspire us to live each day as if it's our last chance to serve Him with all our hearts, while we still have time. We so appreciate your prayers for our children as we try to gently instill an eternal mindset in their young lives.

Presidents' Day - February 17, 2025

Is this Holiday Called Presidents' Day or Washington's Birthday? Although the holiday is most often called "Presidents' Day," the observed federal holiday is officially called "Washington's Birthday."

Neither Congress nor the president has ever stipulated that the name of the holiday observed as Washington's Birthday be changed to Presidents' Day. In a sense, calling the holiday Presidents' Day helps us reflect on not just the first president but also our nation's founding, its values, and what Washington calls in his Farewell Address the "beloved Constitution and union, as received from the Founders." Also, Abraham Lincoln's birthday is February 12, so by calling the holiday "Presidents' Day," we can also include another remarkable president in our celebrations.

George Washington (1732-1799)

On April 30, 1789, George Washington, standing on the balcony of Federal Hall on Wall Street in New York, took his oath of office as the first President of the United States. "As the first of every thing, in our situation will serve to establish a Precedent," he wrote James Madison, "it is devoutly wished on my part, that these precedents may be fixed on true principles."

What were Washington's last words? Answer: "Tis well"

The last conversation George Washington had was with his secretary, Tobias Lear, concerning his burial arrangements. "Have me decently buried; and do not let my body be put into the vault in less than three days after I am dead." Fears of being buried too soon were common in the 18th century. According to his wishes, Washington was not buried for three days. During that time his body lay in a mahogany casket in the New Room. On December 18, 1799 a solemn funeral was held at Mount Vernon. Washington is the only president to have a state named for him, and is the only president not to live in the White House.

Abraham Lincoln (February 12, 1809 – April 15, 1865)

At 6 foot, 4 inches, Abraham Lincoln was the tallest president. ~ Lincoln was the first president to be born outside of the original thirteen colonies. ~ Lincoln was the first president to be photographed at his inauguration. John Wilkes Booth (his assassin) can be seen standing close to Lincoln in the picture.. ~ There are no direct descendents of Abraham Lincoln even though he had 4 sons. ~ During the Civil War, telegraph wires were strung to follow the action on the battlefield. But there was no telegraph office in the White House, so Lincoln went across the street to the War Department to get the news. ~ Lincoln was the only president to receive a patent, for a device for lifting boats over shoals. ~ Lincoln's son, Robert, who was in Washington when his father was killed, was also on the scene when President Garfield was shot in 1881, and when President McKinley was assassinated in 1901. ~ Lincoln and his wife held séances in the White House. They had a great interest in psychic phenomena. ~ Lincoln was the first president to wear a beard.
